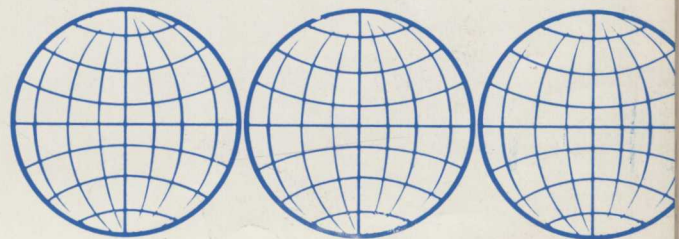

State Champions

The 1965-66 basketball team will long be remembered at Young Harris College. This was the group that won the coveted Junior College State Championship.

The championship was not won easily, for the league contained several strong teams. Also, the '65-'66 Mountain Lions were not an overpowering team. They had no twenty point scorers, no phenomenal shooters, no tremendously fast players, and very little height. Yet they possessed a quality usually found among winners, one which is best summarized in a word so overworked that it seems almost trite: teamwork. On offense the Mountain Lions moved the ball rapidly as they ran their patterns and worked for the good shot. The man-to-man defense set up quickly and tenaciously strove to keep opponents away from close shooting range. In other words, the Mountain Lions were well-disciplined, a fact which reflects the excellent coaching job done by Mr. Luke Rushton. This team was not Coach Rushton's first state championship crew, and it probably will not be his last.

Team balance, another mark of good coaching well-received, characterized the '65-'66 champions. Four players, Terry McLendon, Jimmy McLendon, Vic Stewart, and Bill Douthit, possessed double-figure scoring averages. Two players, Steve Cottle and Lamar Adams, were only a fraction of a point away from double-figure averages. Terry McLendon led all scores with a 16.5 point average per game. A strong scoring performance by Jimmy Smith in the first two games of the state tournament greatly contributed to the Lions' entrance into the finals. The top rebounders for the season were Adams, Douthit, and the McLendon brothers. Bill Douthit, Jimmy McLendon, and Terry McLendon were selected for the All-Tournament Team.

The 1966 *Enotah* staff regretfully bids farewell to sophomores Steve Cottle, Bill Douthit, Terry McLendon, Jimmy Smith, and Vic Stewart. We also wish to thank Coach Rushton and the entire team for their hard work and the enjoyable and rewarding season.

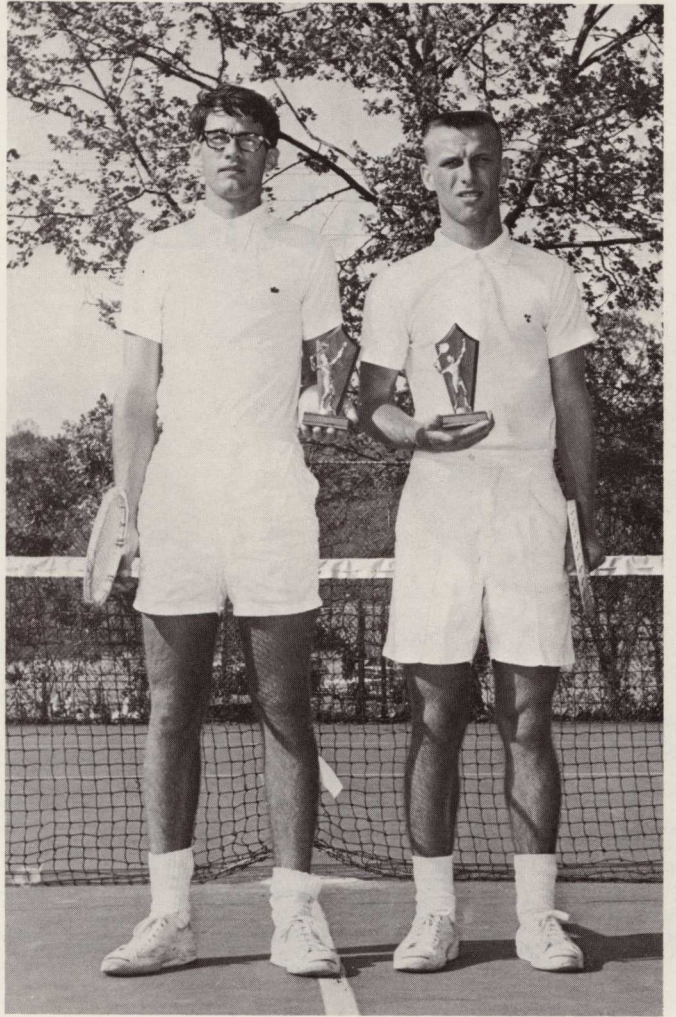
State Champions



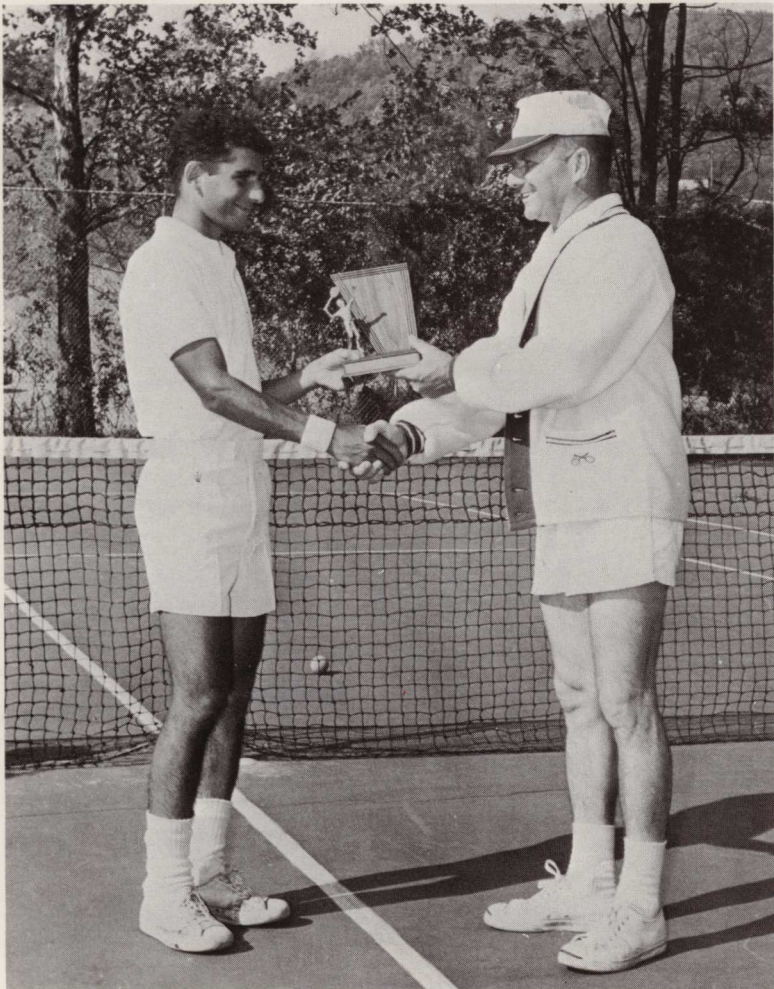

Dorcas Club

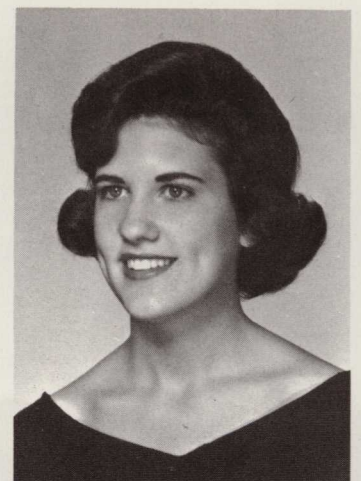

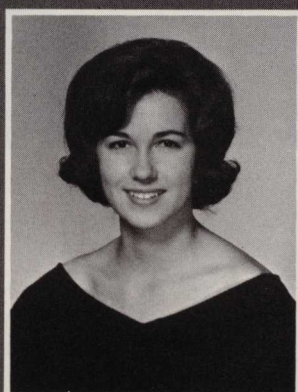
Spat Club
