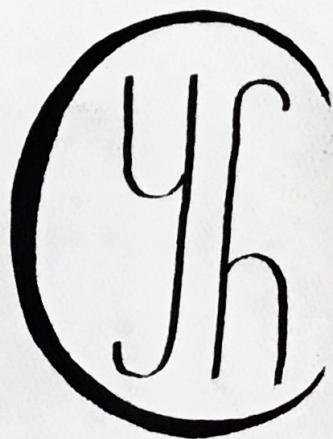

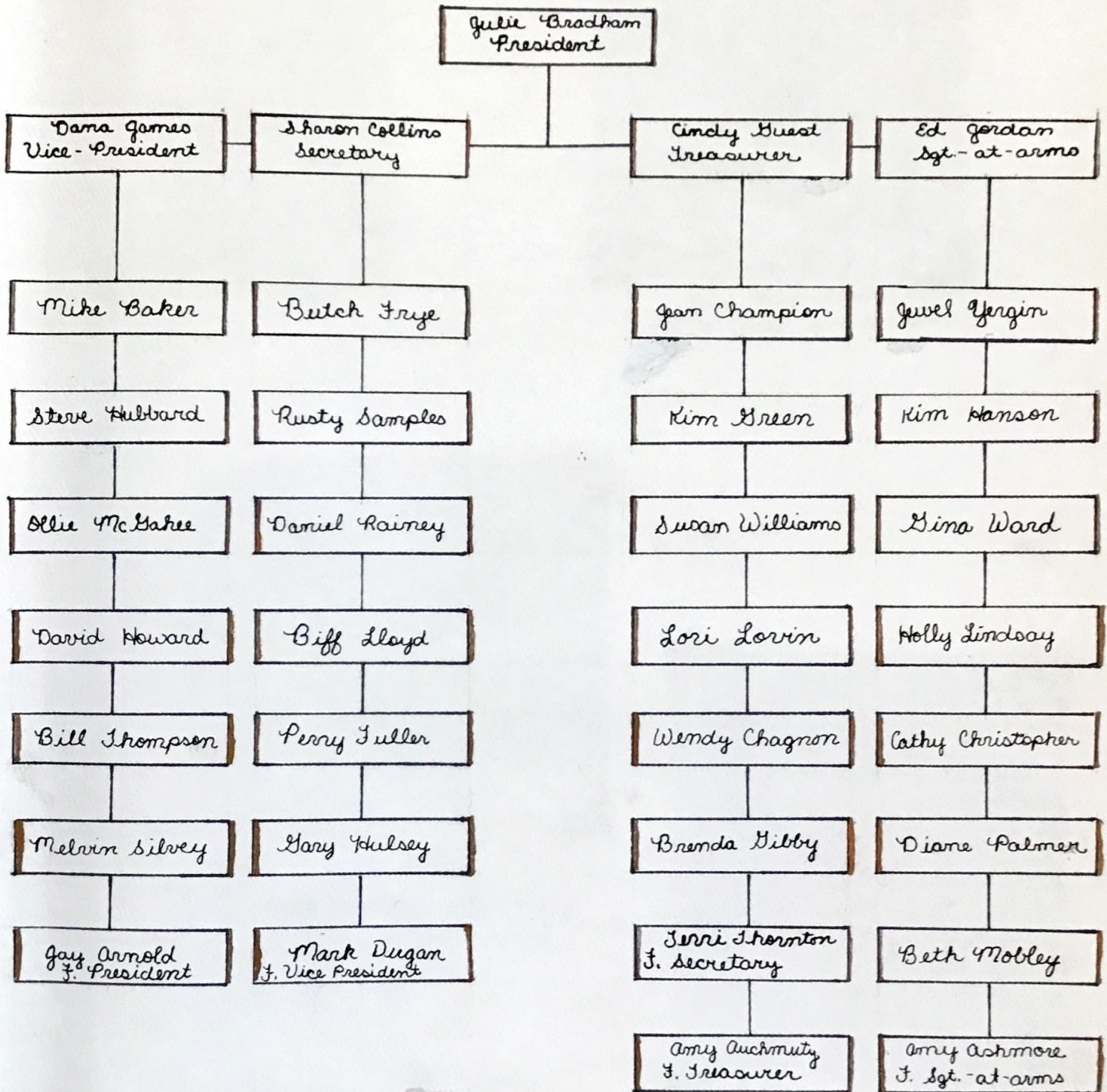

The Student Senate of Young Harris College met on Sept. 13, 1978 in the top of Sharp. The meeting was called to order by President Julie Bradham. The roll was then taken.

Cindy Guest reported that the treasury contains \$929.43 on account, and \$90.00 in petty cash. The Senators were reminded to give \$3.00 to Cindy for ordering Student Senate T-shirts.

Ed Jordon then thanked Dr. Farley for the improvements made around campus. All students were asked to have parking permits by Friday, Sept. 15. They will begin checking all cars Monday, Sept. 18. Attention will be paid especially to cars parked in the Commuters' parking area and in front of driveways.

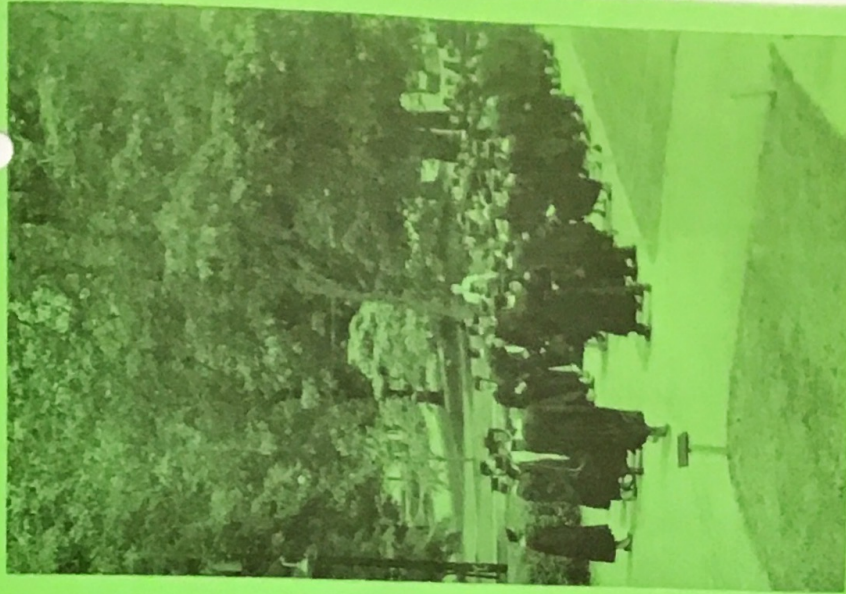

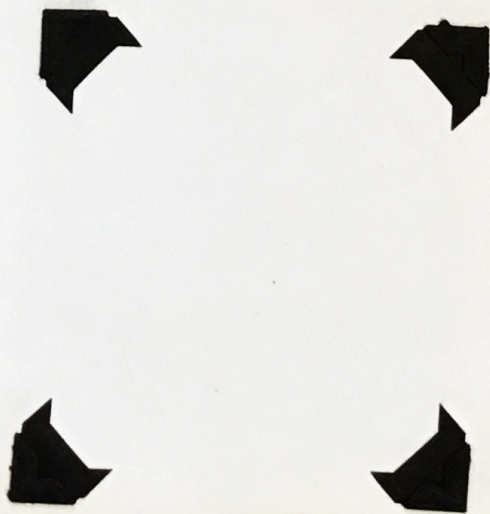

It was suggested that we buy an extension cord for the bands to use in the Student Center. Ollie McGahee said that it would be easier to put a 220 volt outlet down stairs.

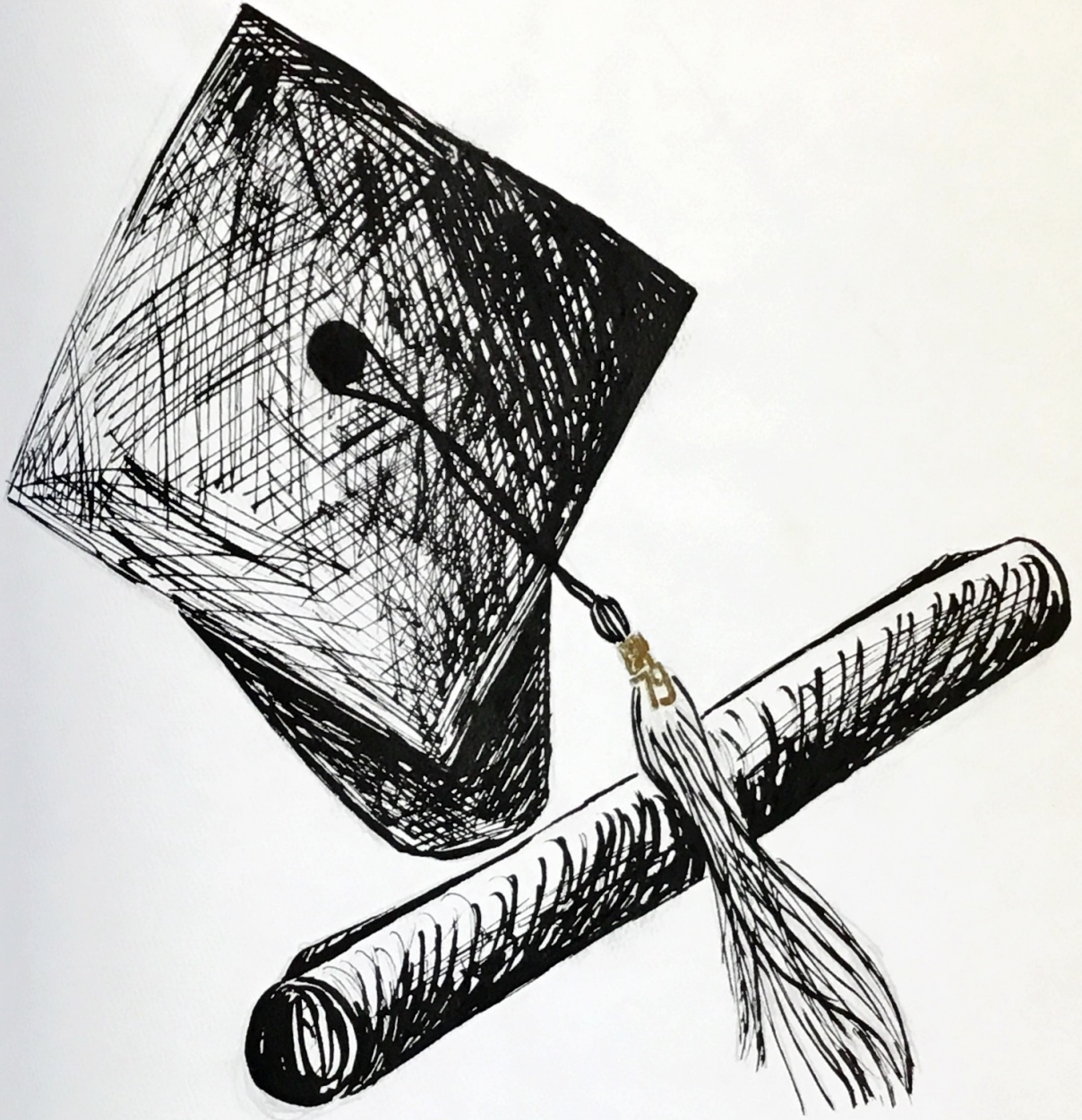
On May 30, Quantrek and the Art Students League are sponsoring a campus clean-up from 4:00 - 5:00. Everyone is urged to come out and help.
