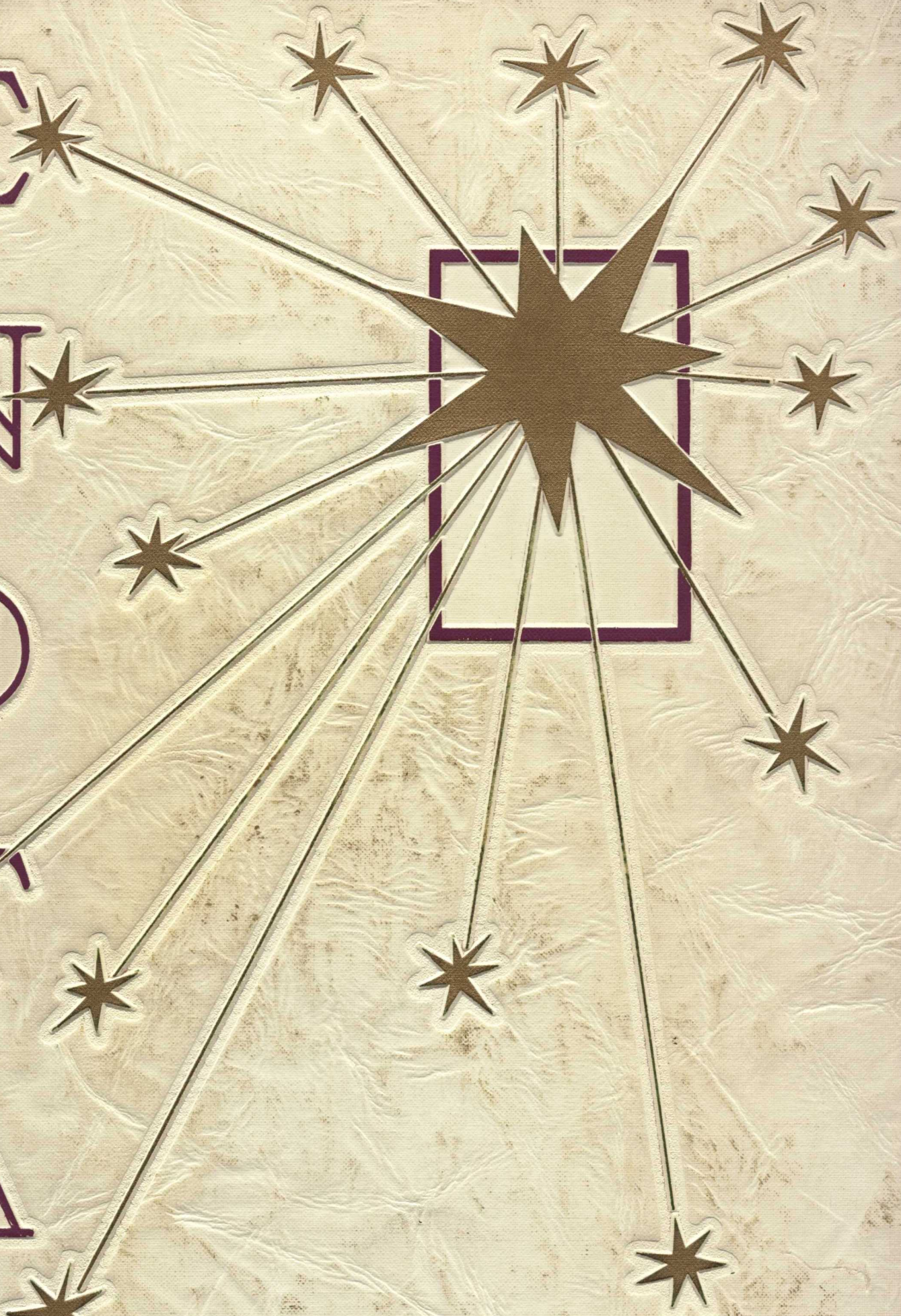

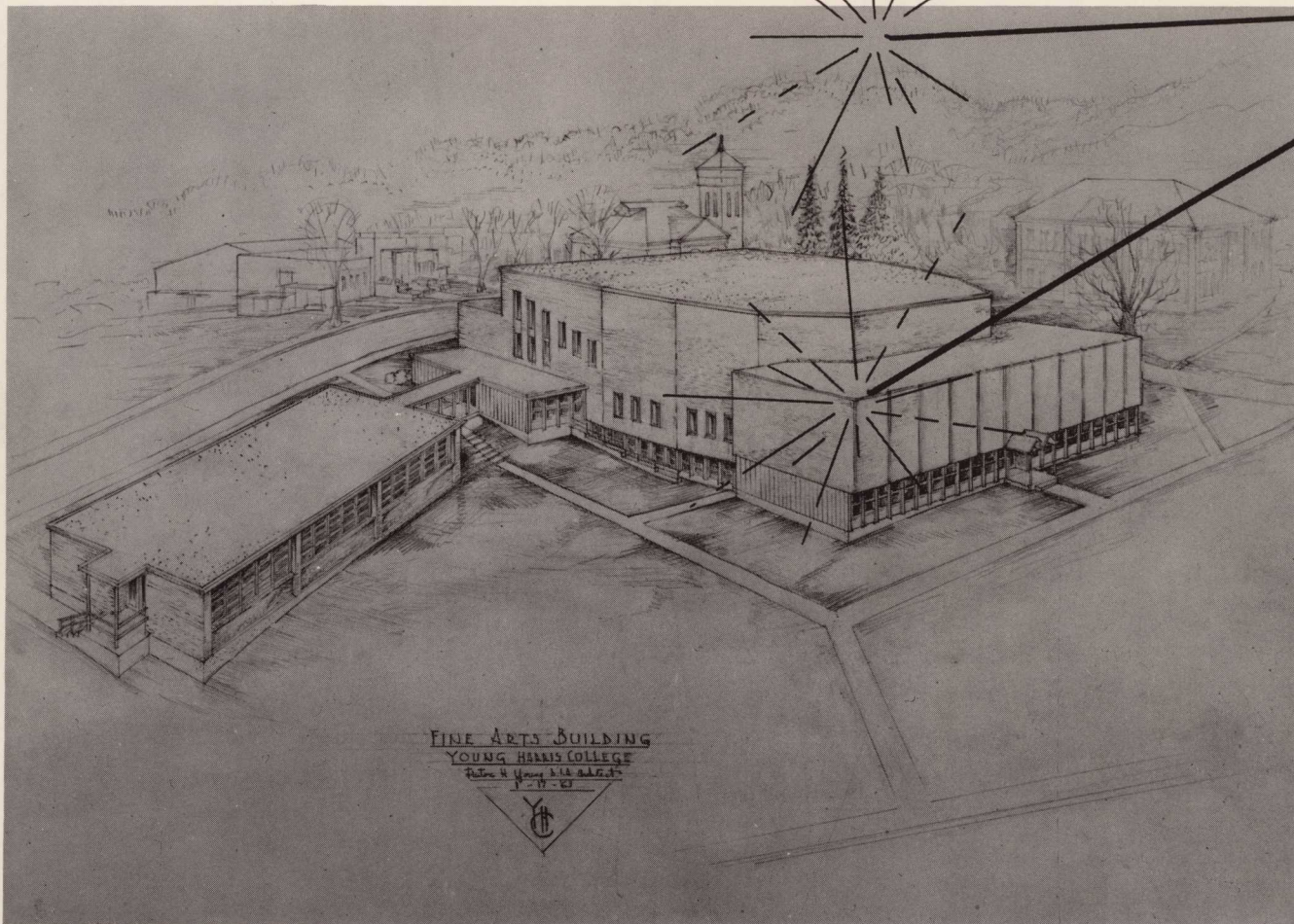

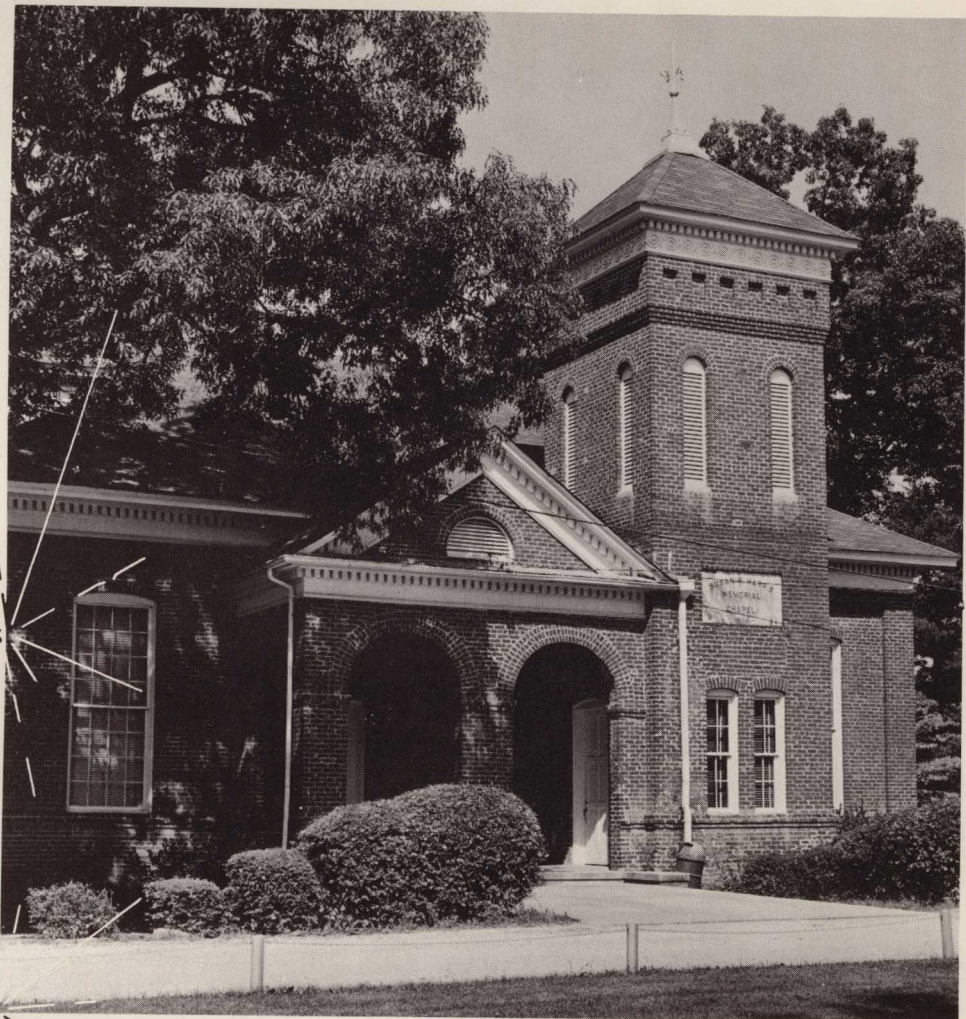

SUNBURST—radiating not merely an account of a school year and events but the capture of a spirit, the prevailing quality which is Young Harris.

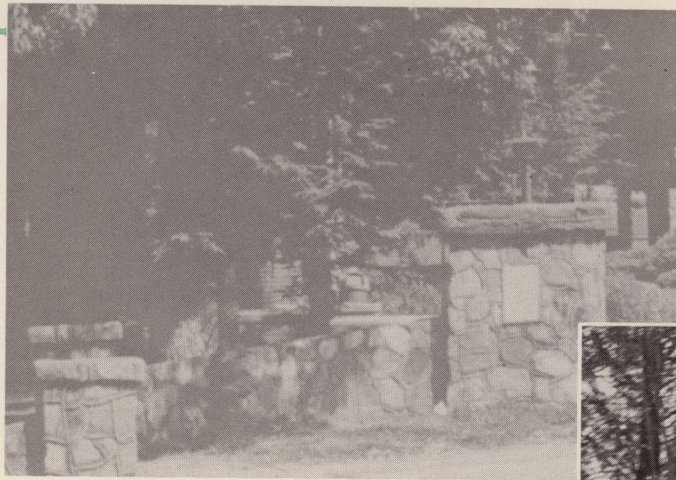

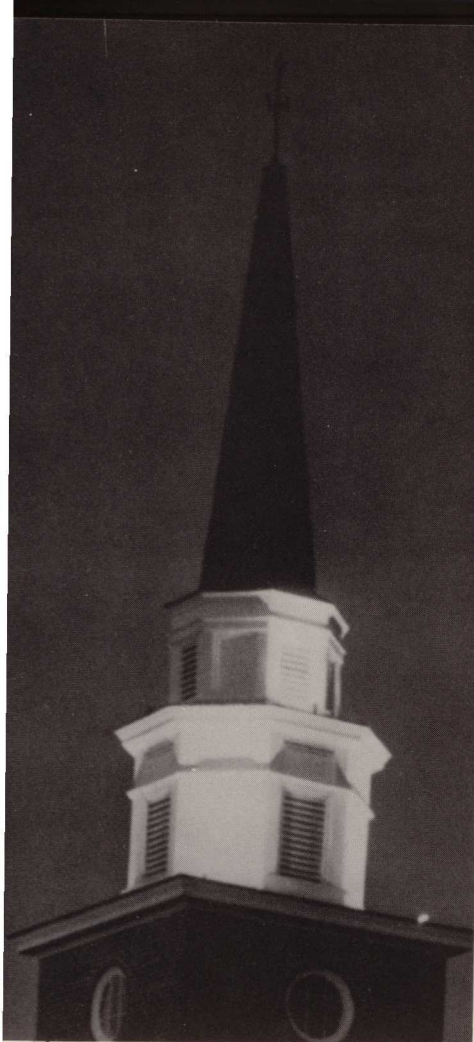

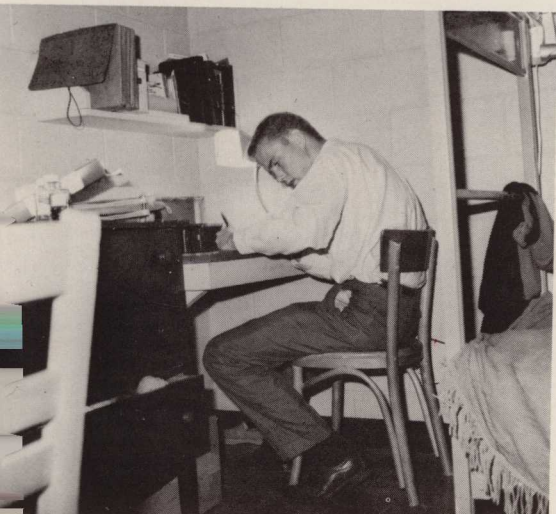

Mountain Lions

"They said it couldn't be done"; but the impossible did happen here again this year on the Young Harris campus. The Mountain Lions, under the charge of Coach Luke Rushton, were able to dribble their way into national attention in the basketball world for the third year in a row. The cagers burned up the nets as they defeated such opponents as the Barons from down South, the Clarke County Clodhoppers, and split the series with the North Avenue Technical School from Atlanta.

The stars of this Cinderella team were Roger Arrington, whose 20-foot jump shot earned him the leading scorer for the team; Larry Bagby, an ace of a rebounder; John Cash, whose "under the basket shot" won many heart-breakers; and Wayne Johnson, whose crisp shots delighted the crowd on many occasions.

Top scoring honors went to Roger Arrington with 22.1 points per game. Freshmen John Cash and Wayne Johnson

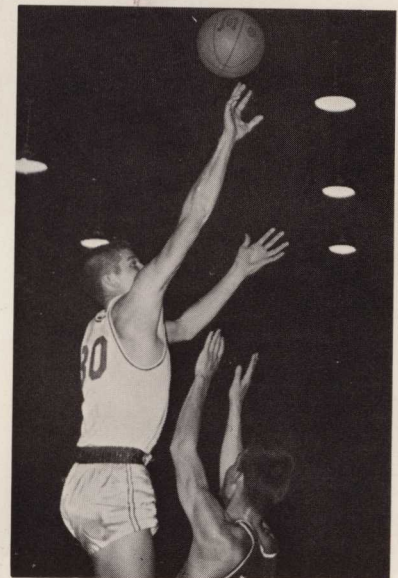
captured second and third place honors with 14.1 and 11.3 points respectively. Chief rebounder, Larry Bagby, won the fourth-place slot with an average of 7.8 points. A total of 2013 points were scored during the regular season, with an average of 77.4 points scored per game.

After ending the regular season on a disappointing note with the loss of the last four games, it was "on to Statesboro" to the State tourney. The team found its way back into the winning column on the first night by defeating Georgia Military College. In the next game, "Lady Luck" dealt the team a deadly blow in the form of a loss to Abraham Baldwin.

The 1963 ENOTAH would like to express its sincere thanks to the sophomores of this team: Larry Bagby, Bob Mitchell, and Roger Arrington. It was their fine show of team work and sportsmanship that led the 1962-63 edition of the Young Harris basketball team to a successful season on the hardwoods.

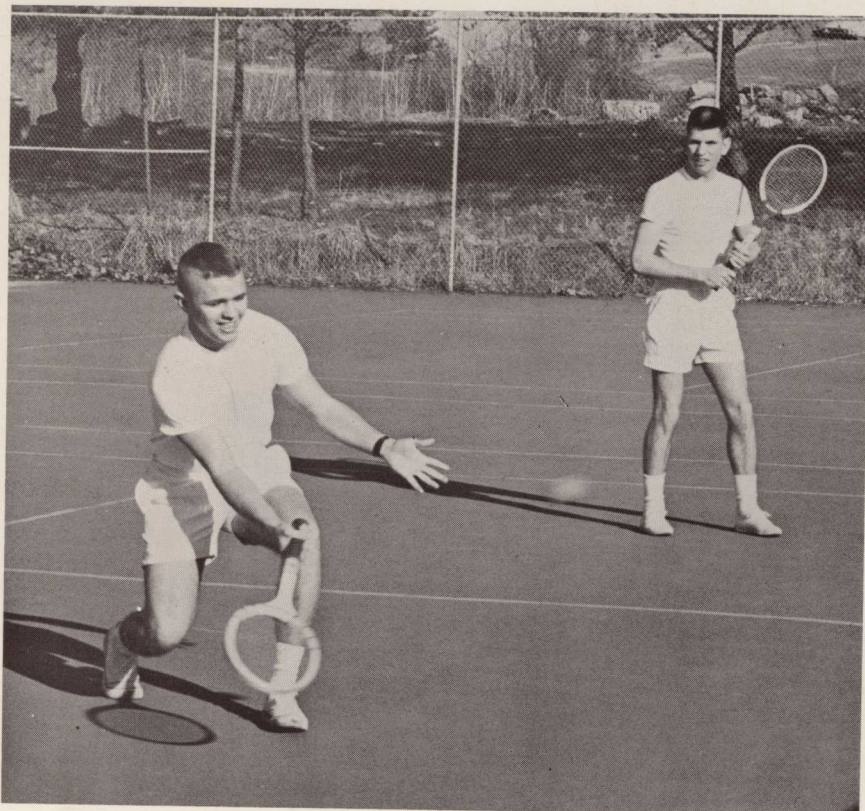

Enotah Echoes

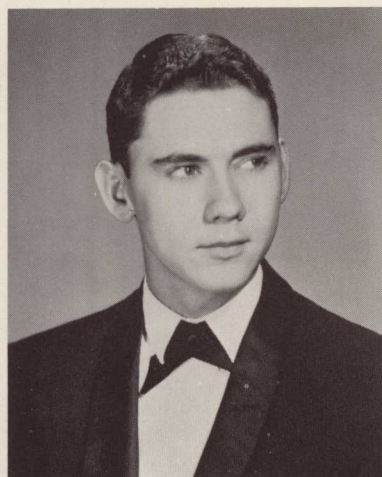

contests; and notices of scheduled events to come. Through its editorials, features, and news stories, the *Enotah Echoes* presented an accurate view of our college life.

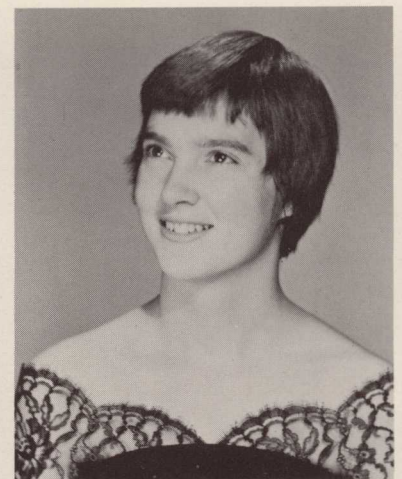

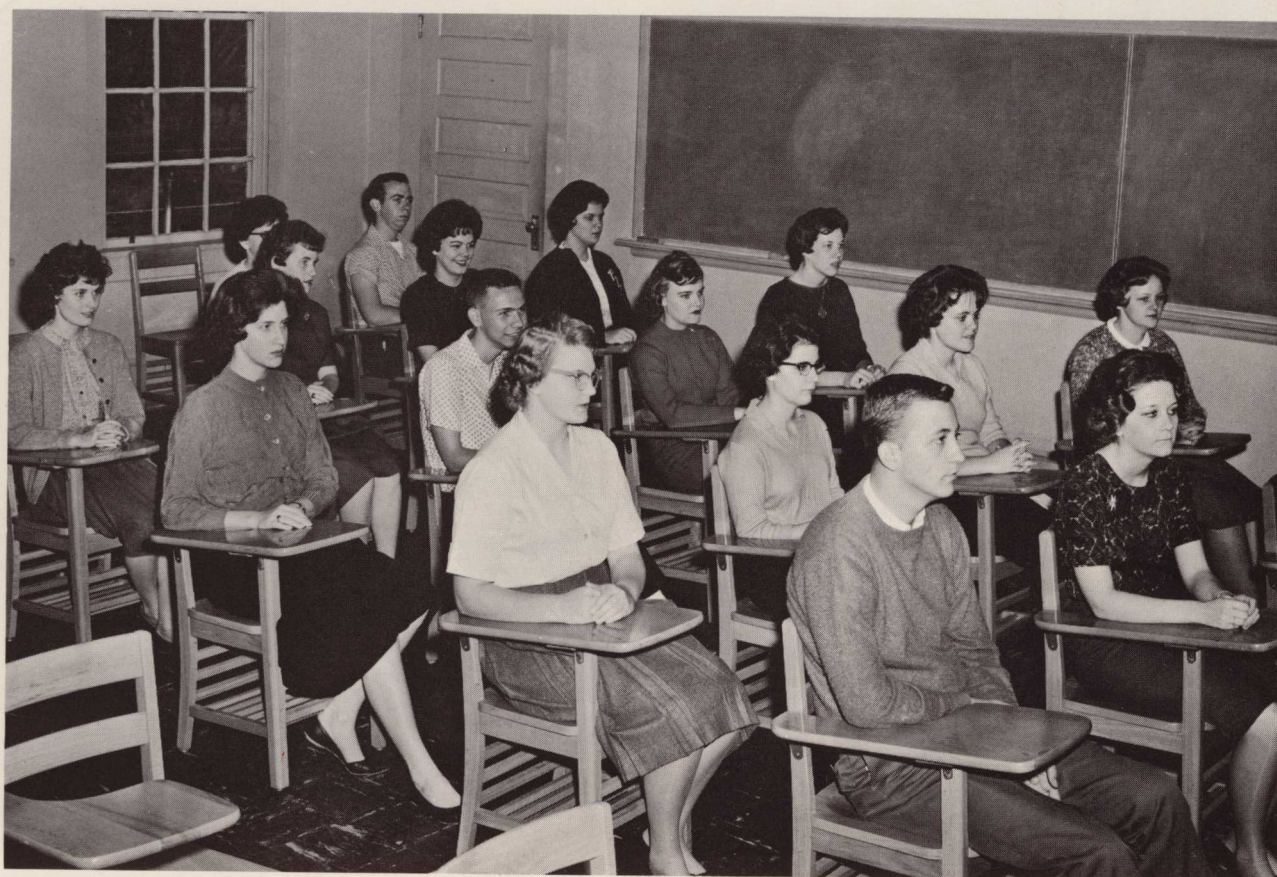

The purpose of the organization is to help those students who are considering the teaching profession to become better acquainted with the state program of education.

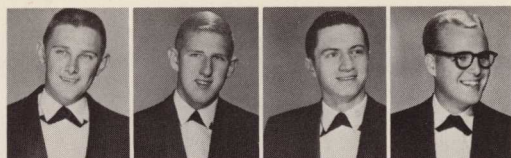
This year the group worked on money making projects to help needy families in the community and

One of the five religious organizations on campus is the Ministerial Conference, the stepping stone to fame for many future ministers in the Methodist Church.

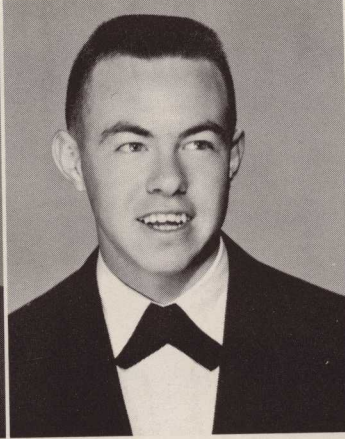

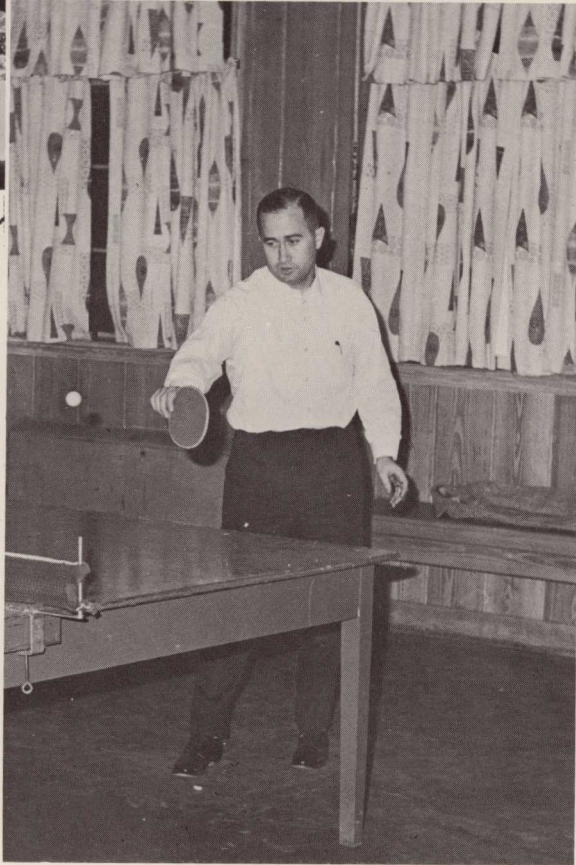

From the editor ...

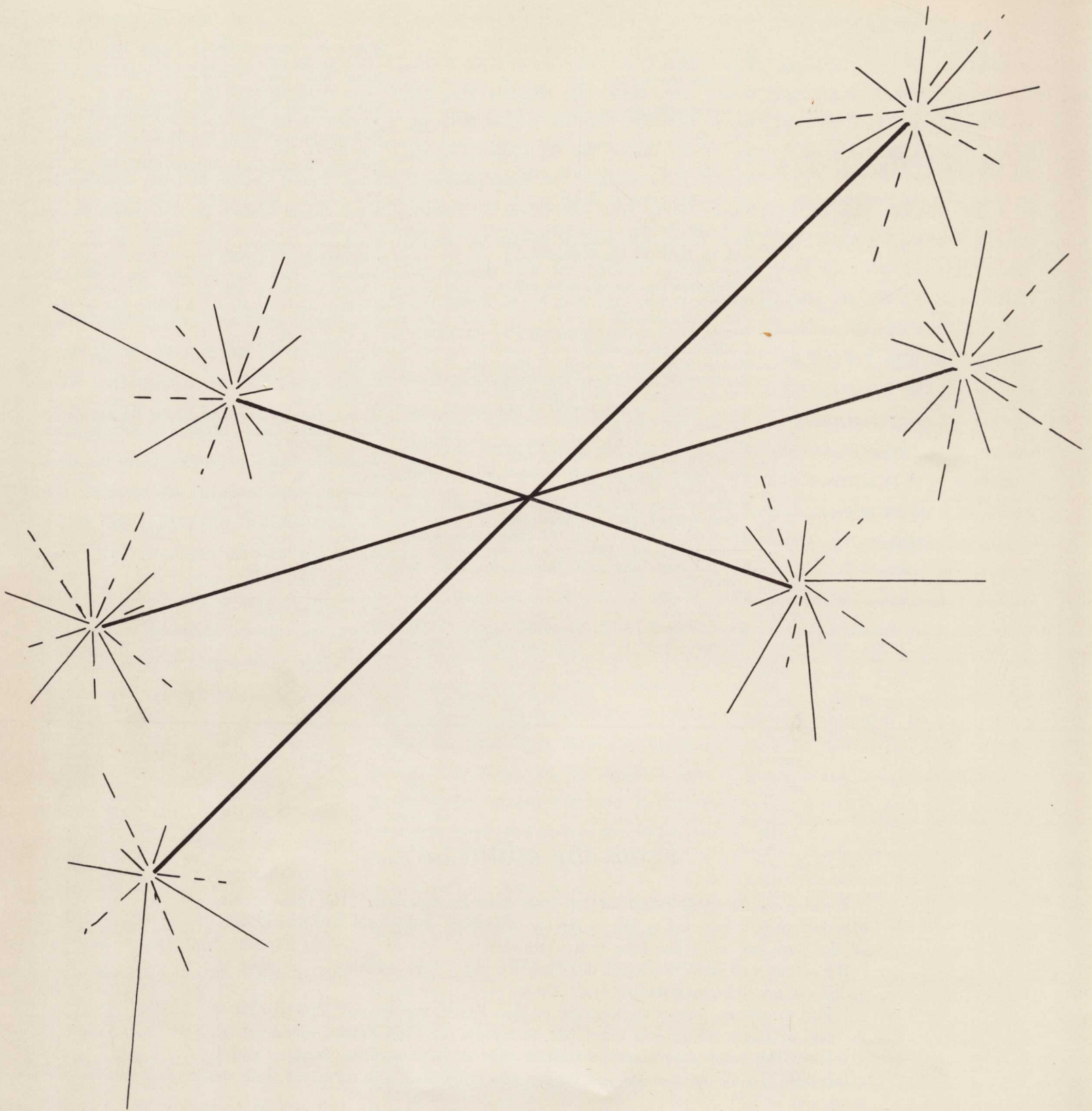
