A Letter from Dr. Ray Farley, President, YHC

President's Report

Since we have just completed the fifth year of my administration at Young Harris College, it is an appropriate time to give a brief summary of this period.

In the fall of 1971 only 340 students were enrolled; by 1976, the number had increased to 526. The average enrollment for 1971-72 was 318; for 1975-76 the average was 481. This is an increase of 51 percent. Of the students enrolled this fall, 89 percent are Georgians, 36 percent are Methodist and 32 percent are Baptist. The attitudes of the students have changed since 1971. They are now more serious minded and more concerned about academics. The number of graduates has increased proportionately with the enrollment.

From 1971 to 1976 curricula changes have occurred to reflect our needs. Courses have been added and dropped in every division. One of the major changes has been in the improvement and expansion of the business program. The program has not been in existence long enough to give a true appraisal of its impact, but we now have more students and better qualified students enrolled in it. Increasing requests for information are coming from counselors and parents.

The faculty has been strengthened and instruction has been improved through the program of Tenure and Development approved by the Board in 1973. Since 1971, three full-time faculty and staff (who have given a total of 100 years of service to Young Harris College) have received

During the past five years the financial status of Young

Harris has improved. Approximately \$750,000 has been added to the Endowment and \$1,330,000 has been added to the Plant Fund. Additional property adjacent to the campus costing \$35,000 has been purchased.

Currently, we are beginning one of the campus's most needed academic facilities—the Maxwell Center for Business, Mathematics and Science. When this building is completed our facilities will compare favorably with any junior college in the State.

We still have needs. The recently acquired recreation field needs to be improved and we definitely need three additional tennis courts. Continued campus beautification is a must. Two students from the School of Environmental Design at the University of Georgia will soon complete a master landscape design for the campus.

We are what we are because of those such as you who have given us so much of your wisdom, work, and wealth.

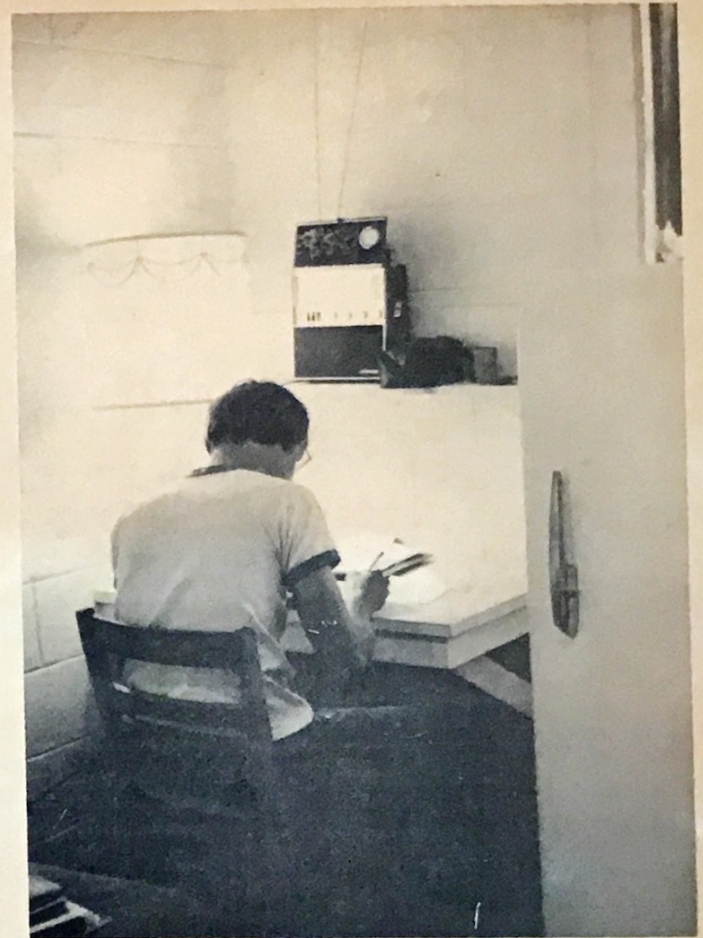



Coach Nichols also said that he would like for the Senate to select a new advisor for this year.


Warren reminded us of the meeting tomorrow morning at 9:15 to set up stations for registration.

Warren is going to write the Amendment concerning the addition of the Vice-President of the Student Senate as the chairman of the Student-Faculty Judicial Board.





At future dances, Senate members will sign for a certain time to work so that things will run smoother.


It was asked that we check into getting another fan for the Student Center. Also, the bathrooms in the Student Center need to have some improvements made.


Warren and Ronnie are going to work on fixing the outside bulletin board by Sharp Hall.


Warren talked to the students about breaking in line at the dining hall and about all the trash that is being scattered on campus. He asked for students to help with both of these matters.


The Freshman Class Officers Nominations will be held on September 27 at 7:30 P.M. in the Clegg Auditorium.

Dr. Hale said that he will try to get something to fix the doors at Sharp Hall.


The Senate agreed to take a Straw Poll to see how many students will be voting in the forthcoming Presidential election. The newspaper will publish the results.


The money collected from traffic fees goes directly to the Dean's activities fund. Therefore, the Senate is indirectly using this money.

The Straw Poll vote will be taken during supper on Wednesday. Bill, Robby, and Jim Mitchell volunteered to help.


It was asked if another phone could be put in the Manget dormitory. Warren said that he would talk to Dr. Hale.

Paul suggested that something be done about the heat in the auditorium during movies and other activities.



Warren was appointed "convocation manager" which means he will coordinate everything, such as turning on the heat, etc...

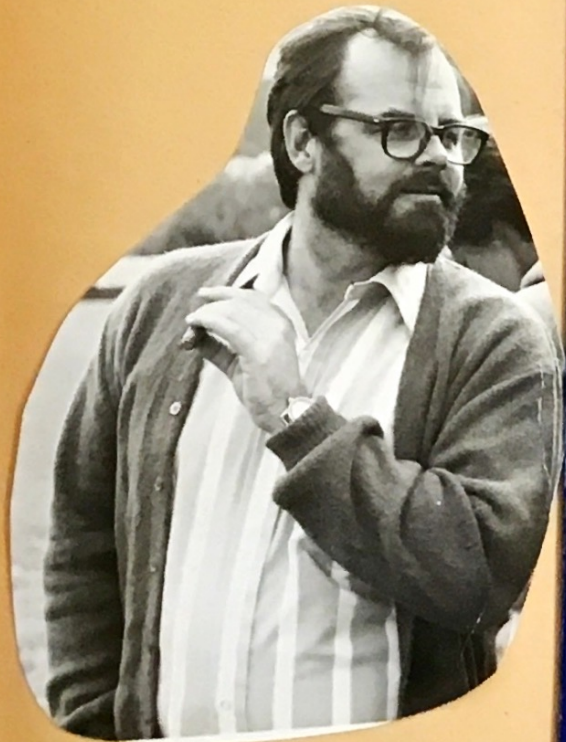

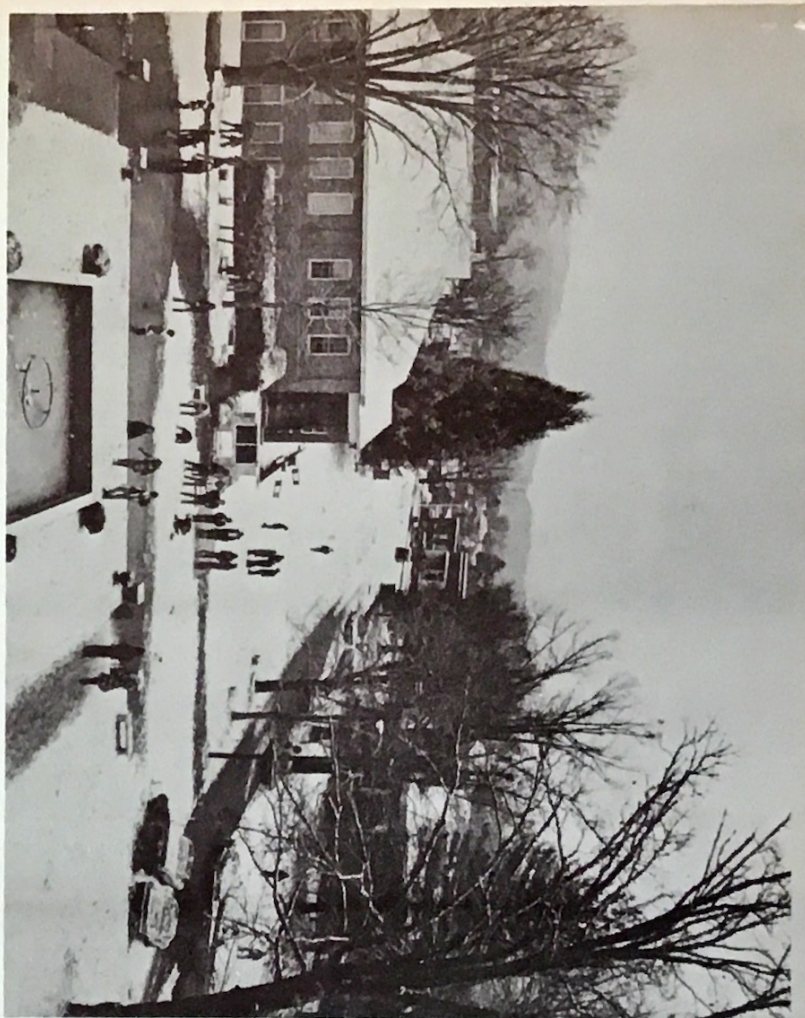
