


Dear James =

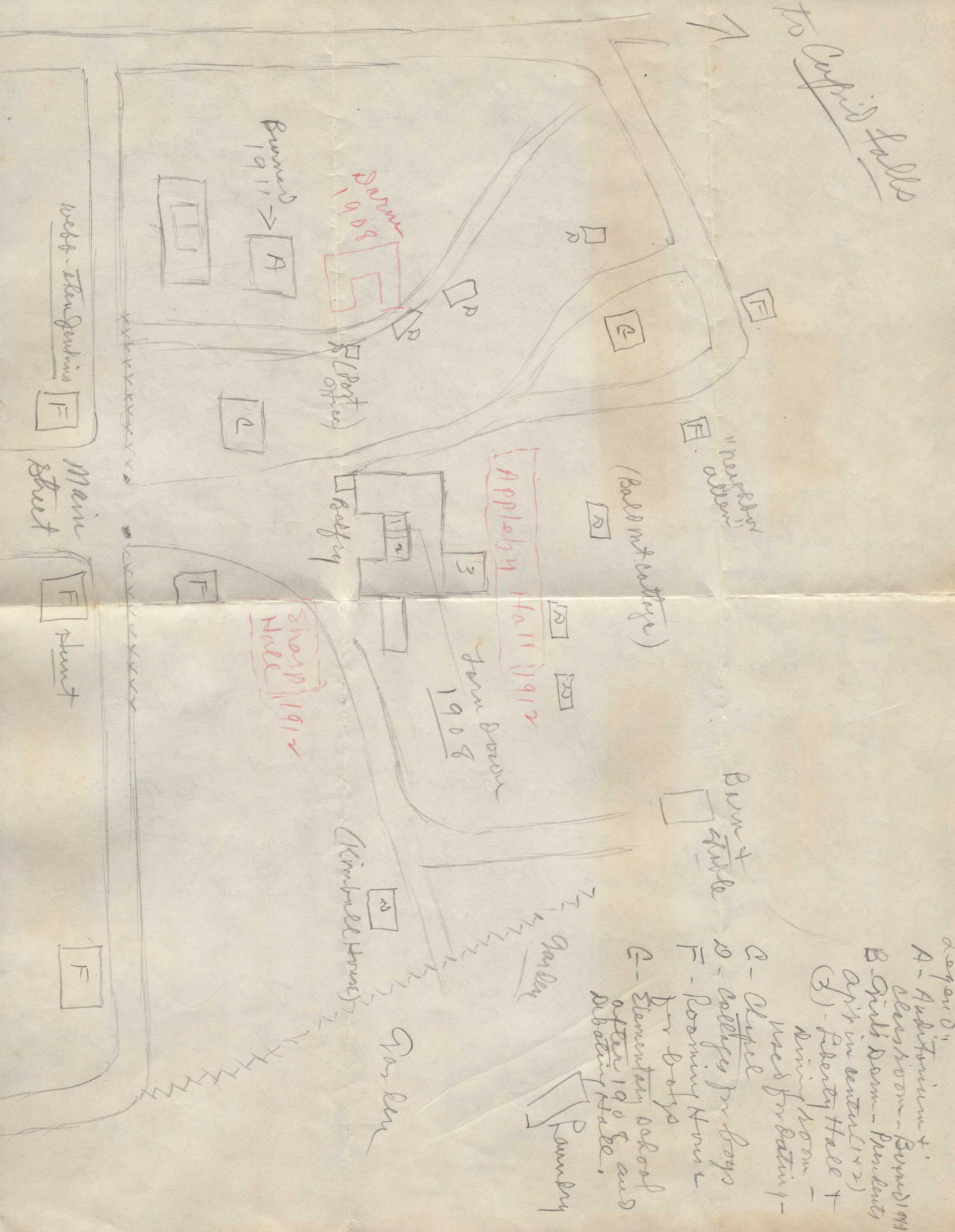
