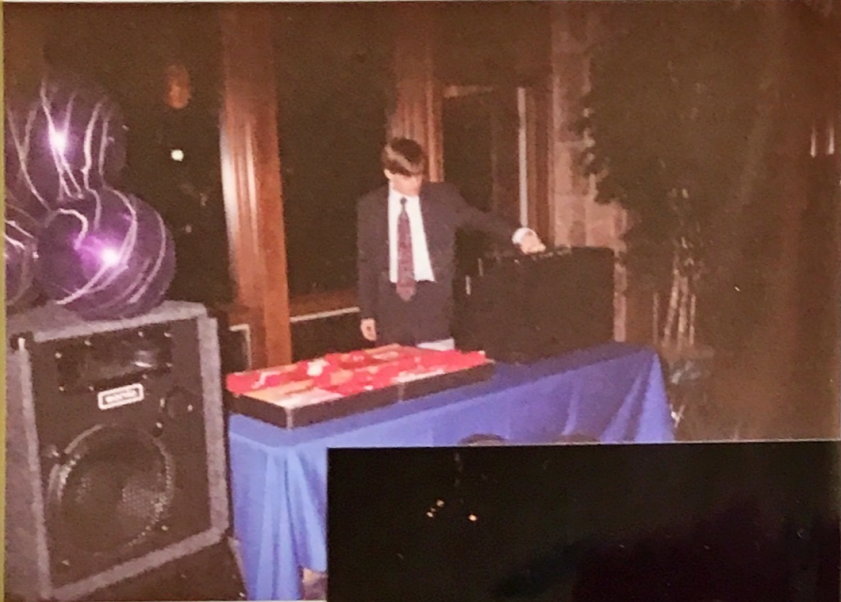

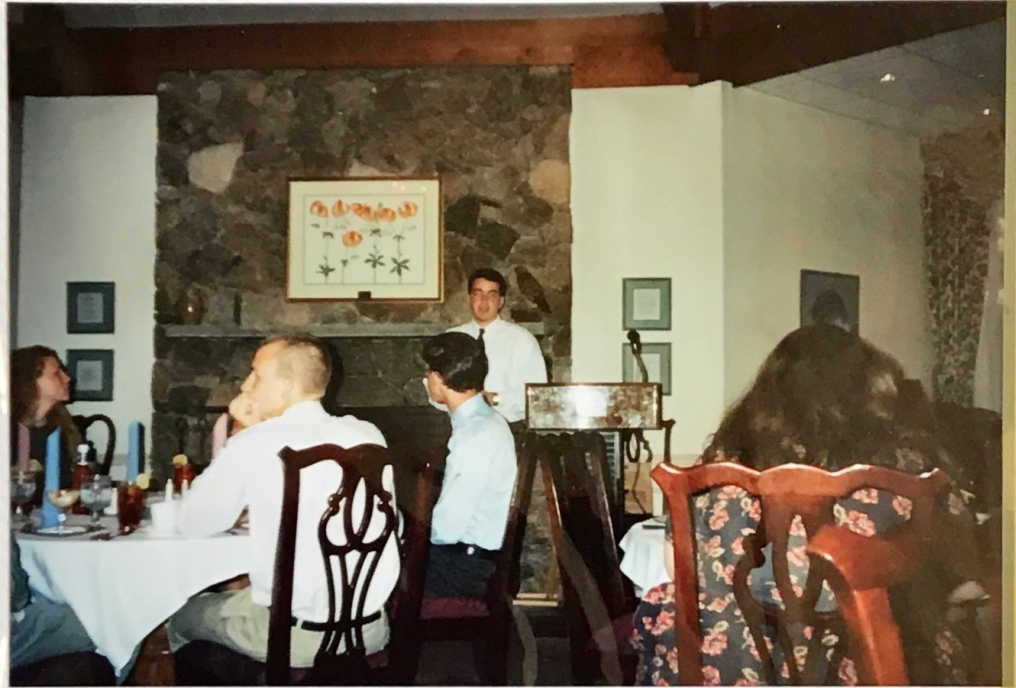

Brian Johnson called the meeting to order and welcomed all the newly elected freshmen and sophomore officers.

Elizabeth Cloaninger opened in prayer and gave the treasurer's report. S.G.A. currently has \$3213.17 in its account.

Audrey Dalton called roll, only Freshman Brandi Justice was absent.

OLD BUSINESS :

Brian brought up the purchasing of an ice machine for student use in Myer's Student Center. He hopes that one will be there for our use by next quarter.

Brian also commented on Center Patio's furniture. He is going to talk to the Activities Board about splitting the costs.

Brian announced that S.G.A. is presenting Dr. Gring-Whitley a \$50 check for CROP walk at chapel tonight and encouraged everyone to attend.

NEW BUSINESS :

Brian congratulated the new members and briefly discussed the differences between high school governments and our S.G.A.

Nominations were accepted for the honorary offices of Historian and Chaplain. There was only one nomination taken for Chaplain and Frannie Deaton accepted the office. There were several nominations for Historian and there will be a vote within S.G.A. for that office next week.

January 19, 1994

Dean Palmour lit the fire so the members would get busy.
