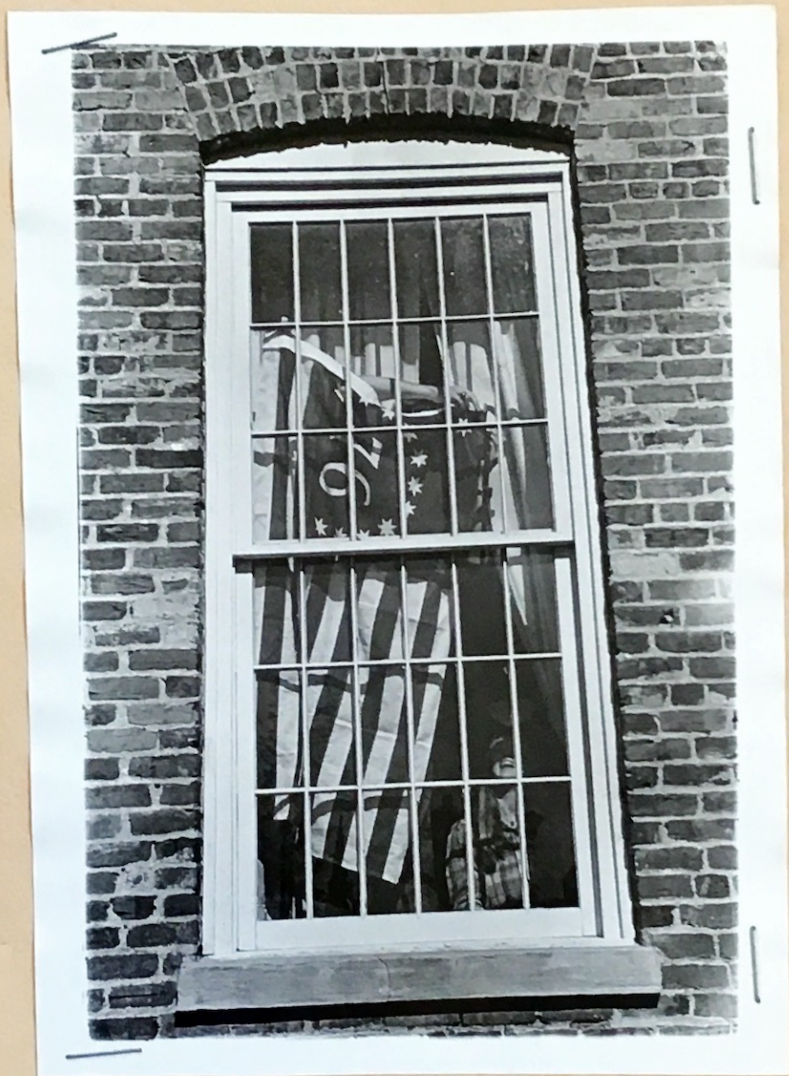
Student Faculty Forum

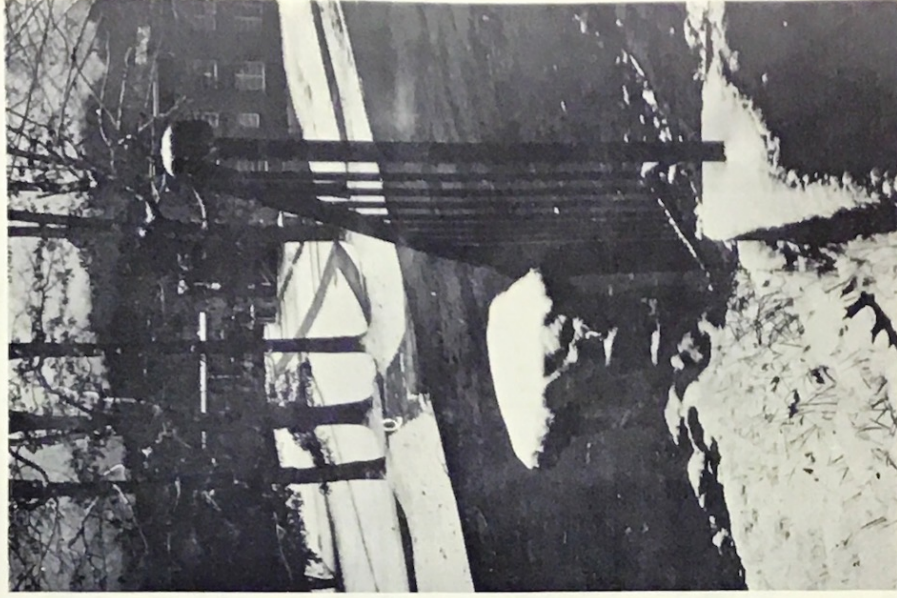

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE
YOUNG HARRIS COLLEGE STUDENT SENATE

Preamble

We, the representatives of the student body of Young Harris College, in order to establish a framework of student government, to stimulate interest in student activities, and to further the ideals of this College, do ordain and establish this constitution for the student body of Young Harris College.

Article I

Section I

There shall be five executive officers of the Young Harris College Student Senate: President, Vice-President, Secretary Treasurer, and Sergeant-At-Arms. These officers shall be nominated before the mid-term of Spring Quarter. The election of officers shall be held after mid-term of Spring Quarter on a date set by the Student Senate in consultation with the Dean of Students. These officers shall assume their duties in the first quarter of the succeeding academic year and shall serve for the entire school year. The qualifications for the Executive Officers shall be those specified in Article II.

Section II

President - The president shall preside over all Student Meetings. He shall vote only in case of a tie. With the approval of the Dean of Students, the President may call a meeting of the student body at any he deems advisable. The president shall have not only the authority to appoint all committees but also to serve as ex-officio member of all committees. He shall inform all students of the powers, actions, and decisions of the Student Senate which affect the entire student body by posting them in an accessible and public place or by making an appropriate announcement. He shall also serve as President of the Council of Presidents.

Vice President - In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President. If the President resigns from office or does not meet qualifications, the Vice-President shall immediately become President. He shall preside over any Sophomore class meetings and shall serve as chairman of the Student Activities Committee.

Secretary - The Secretary shall record the proceedings of all student body and Senate meetings and conduct all correspondence in the interests of the student body. He shall post a copy of all Student Senate minutes on the bulletin board in the Administration building.

Treasurer - The Treasurer shall keep a record of all financial transactions. He shall serve as chairman of the Student Senate Budget Committee and shall work with the Vice-President in determining the budget allocations for all activities of the student body.

Sergeant-At-Arms - The Sergeant-At-Arms shall maintain order at Senate meetings. He shall keep an accurate record of all activity points and shall inform those persons who exceed the limited number. He shall also serve as chairman of the Traffic Committee. He shall also have the duties as listed in Article 5, Section 4.

ARTICLE II

Section 1

The Student Senate shall consist of thirty-five Senate members: five executive officers, ten men and ten women representing students residing on campus; four men or women representing the students living off campus, two representatives from the Freshman Class, and the four Freshman Class officers after their election in the fall.

Section 2

These Senators shall take office three weeks prior to the end of Spring Quarter and shall serve during the succeeding academic year.

Section 3

The grade point average for a person seeking a position in the Student Senate must be at least 2.0 for all courses taken prior to his nomination. A student must have been enrolled at Young Harris College one quarter preceeding his nomination.

ARTICLE III

Section 1

Any executive officer or Student Senate member who is on either conduct probation or academic probation shall be removed from the Senate until his reinstatement is approved by the Campus Judicial Board on request from the Senate.

Section 2

Senate members shall be permitted only two absences from Senate meetings per quarter. If a member exceeds this number he/she will automatically be removed from the Senate.

ARTICLE IV

Section 1

1. The Senate shall have such authority over all students as is approved by the College administration.
2. The Senate shall assume charge of the finances of the Student Government and control and regulate the expenditures thereof. At the first meeting of each quarter, the Treasurer shall present a report of all financial transactions of the previous quarter. At mid-quarter of the Spring Quarter, a member of the administrative staff shall prepare an annual audit of the Student Senate's financial records. The auditor shall be selected by the advisor to the Student Senate.
3. The Student Senate shall assist the Dean of Students in compiling the Student Handbook.

4. The Student Senate shall have the authority to fill all vacancies that may occur in the Senate or any other Senate-appointed position during the course of the year. Vacancies in the Student Senate shall be filled with an equal number of Freshmen and Sophomores.
5. At the beginning of Fall Quarter, the Senate members shall act as hosts for the newly-arrived students at Young Harris College.
6. At the beginning of the school year, the Senate shall subject to the approval of the Dean of Students both the day and time of Senate meetings.
7. At a Senate meeting a quorum of three fifths of the members must be present before any business can be transacted.
8. From its membership, the Senate shall elect an Historian whose duties shall be to record all Student Senate activities and to place these records on file in the College Library. These records shall consist of minutes, committee reports, projects, programs, and various other activities.

Section 2

The Student Government for Summer Quarter shall consist of all outgoing or incoming senators attending summer quarter. These students, in consultation with the Dean of Students, shall perform the duties of the Student Senate.

ARTICLE V

Section 1

To assist in maintaining an orderly environment in which students can pursue their education, to permit students to participate actively in dormitory life, and to assume due process, certain judicial bodies and processes have been established.

Section 2

These judicial bodies and their membership shall consist of:

1. Dormitory Judicial Board
 - a. The Assistant Director of the dormitory shall serve as chairman. The board members shall be selected by the Dormitory Director and approved by the Dean of Students. Office shall be terminated by resignation or removal by the Dean of Students because of violation of school policy.
2. Student-Faculty Judicial Board
 - a. The Student-Faculty Judicial Board shall be composed of three faculty members and four students. One of these students shall serve, upon selection by the Board, as chairman and may vote only in case of a tie.
 - b. The Student-Faculty Judicial Board faculty members shall be appointed by the Dean of Students and the student members for the following year shall be elected by the Student Senate during the Spring Quarter.
3. Campus Judicial Board
 - a. This board shall be composed of three students and four faculty members. One of these faculty members shall serve, upon appointment by the Dean of Students, as chairman and may vote only in case of a tie.

- b. During Spring Quarter of each year, the Campus Judicial Board student members for the following year shall be elected by the Student Senate and faculty members shall be appointed by the Dean of Students.

Section 3

No individual may serve simultaneously on more than one board within the levels of the Judicial System.

Section 4

All complaints and alleged violations shall be registered with the Sergeant-at-Arms who will refer them to the Student Faculty Judicial Board.

Section 5

1. Dormitory Judicial Boards

- a. These boards shall interpret and enforce rules and regulations made by the Student Senate and the College administration which affect the dormitories.
- b. The Dormitory Judicial Boards shall hear all individual discipline cases. The alleged violator's case shall be heard by the Dormitory Judicial Board of the dormitory in which he resides.
- c. The Dormitory Judicial Boards shall educate the residents of the dormitory as to Student Senate and College Administration rules and regulations.

2. Student Faculty Judicial Board

- a. This board shall serve as a judiciary body of the student government and shall interpret and enforce Student Senate and College administration rules and regulations which affect the campus.
- b. It shall assume jurisdiction granted to Dormitory Judicial Boards where such boards do not exist.
- c. It shall have original jurisdiction of cases involving dining hall, library, and traffic violations. It shall hear cases referred by a member of the staff, faculty, administration, or student body. The person who has referred the case to the Student Faculty Judicial Board must appear as a witness before the Student Faculty Judicial Board.

Campus Judicial Board

- a. This board shall serve as a Judiciary body of the Student Government and shall interpret and enforce Student Senate and College administration rules and regulations which affect the campus.
- b. It shall serve as the highest judicial board within student government.
- c. It shall have appellate jurisdiction of cases heard by the Dormitory Judicial Boards and the Student Faculty Judicial Board.
- d. It shall have appellate jurisdiction of cases involving the violation of campus traffic regulations.

Section 6

1. Dormitory Judicial Boards may recommend appropriate disciplinary action, including the restriction of social activities within the dormitory, payment of compensation, and the requirement of service projects within the dormitory. They may recommend to the Dean of Students a change of room or dormitory.

2. The Board, in addition to the sanctions listed in Section 5, Article 1, may recommend appropriate disciplinary action and require service projects on the campus. The board may also order the violating individual or organization to comply with the Student Senate Constitution and set a time limit for such compliance.
3. A person shall not be tried more than once for the same offense.

Section 7

All Judicial Board hearings shall be closed to those not immediately involved in the case being heard.

Section 8

Files containing the minutes of Judicial Board proceedings shall be retained in the office of the Dean of Students. Records of individual Judicial Board cases will be available only to the members of the Judicial Board concerned, the College counseling staff, the student who is directly affected.

Section 9

No student shall be assessed major disciplinary action by the above-mentioned boards unless he is advised explicitly, in writing, of any charges against him when the case is presented, given the opportunity to answer accusations, and submit the testimony of witnesses. A student who has been found in violation of a regulation shall be notified in writing by the appropriate Judicial authority of its decision and the assessed penalty, if any. In any case in which individual disciplinary action has been taken, the individual has the right of appeal. In every case in which a judicial decision is appealed, the appeal will be heard by the next highest judicial authority.

Section 10

The President of the College is the final authority in all decisions arising from judicial proceedings.

ARTICLE VI

1. Any proposals for amendments to or revisions of the Student Senate Constitution must be voted on by the present Senate members and by the incoming members, if the new senate has been elected. These changes must be approved by a simple majority vote.
2. The proposed amendment or revision is then submitted to the President of the Student Senate, who must act on it within forty-eight hours of receiving it. If the amendment or revision is vetoed by the president, a vote of two-thirds of the Student Senate is necessary to override the veto.
3. After the President of the Student Senate either approves the amendment or revision, or does not act within the stated time, the amendment is referred to the Dean of Students for his approval.

Section 1

In regular elections, the student body shall vote in a designated place, presided over by two Student Senate members. If a ballot is incorrectly marked, it shall be discarded. The vote shall be counted privately by the Sergeant-At-Arms at the end of the designated voting period.

Section 2

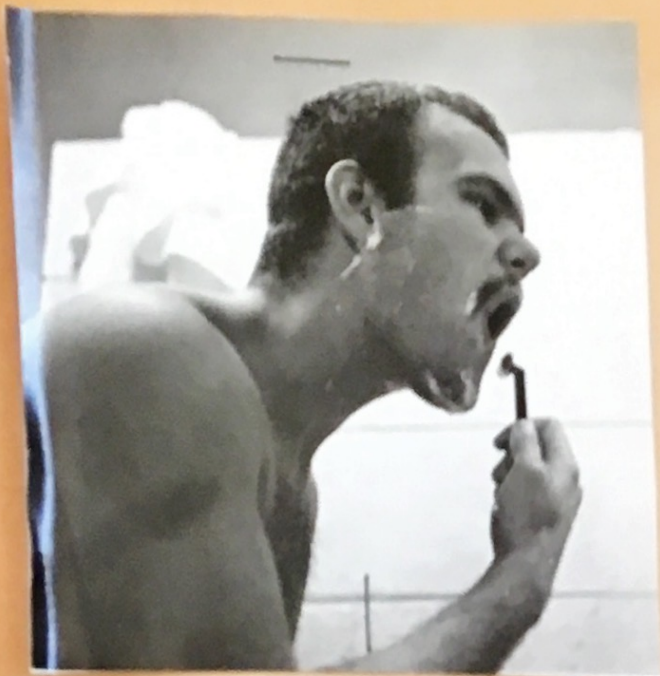
Candidates for the Student Senate may be nominated at an open called meeting of the Student Senate or by a Statement of Intent. With the consent of the Student Senate, the Executive Committee shall announce the rules and regulations for the elections.

Section 3

1. The ballot shall contain all nominated candidates approved by the Dean of Students according to Article II, Section 3. They shall be elected by popular vote.
2. In the event of a tie for last position, a run-off election shall be held.

Section 4

1. Nominations for Freshman Class Officers and representatives shall be held each year on the last Monday of September. Campaigning may begin the following morning at 8:00 A.M. Elections shall be held on the first Thursday following the nominations.
2. Nominations are to be made for the following offices: President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Sergeant-At-Arms. These officers shall represent the Freshman Class in all Student Senate proceedings.
3. The election shall continue for two hours. Officers shall be elected by a simple majority.





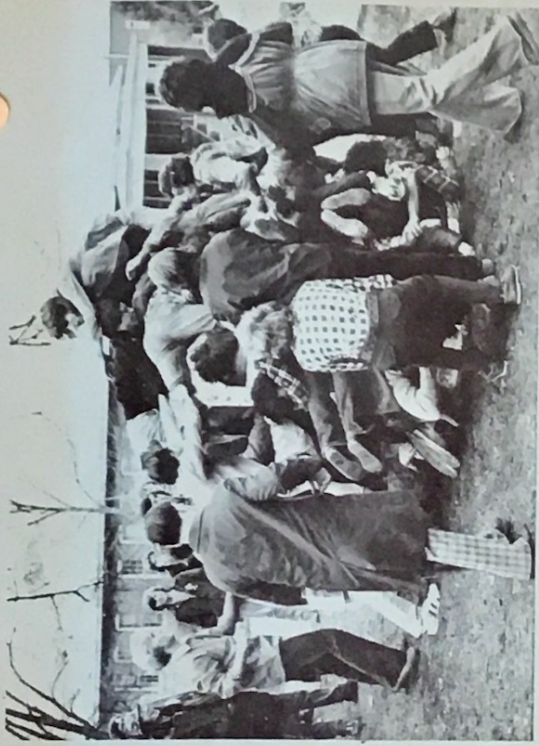
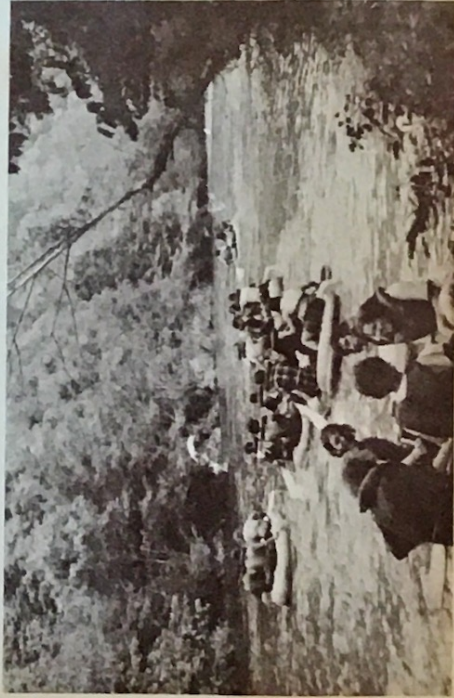

I personally don't know; I am only qualified to say that the average student is not interested.

In the upcoming year, however, the student senate will be under new management. We have elected new officers, and maybe things can change; but then again, maybe they won't. The student senate was a great idea, but its purpose has diluted itself into authoritative yes's and no's. Let the student say a little more, the student senate represent a little more, and the faculty listen a little more, and more people will be satisfied. I think the students should have a little more say so on the matters concerning them; after all, who's putting out the money for the education, the students? So Up with Student Senate next year. And that's a big "10-04"
