And told him where to go.

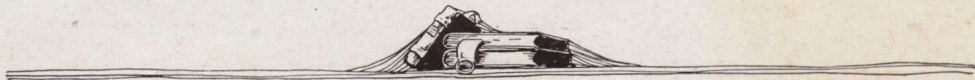

Many members belong to both the glee clubs. We have as one of our members, B. C. Crockett, the nightingale of Young Harris College.

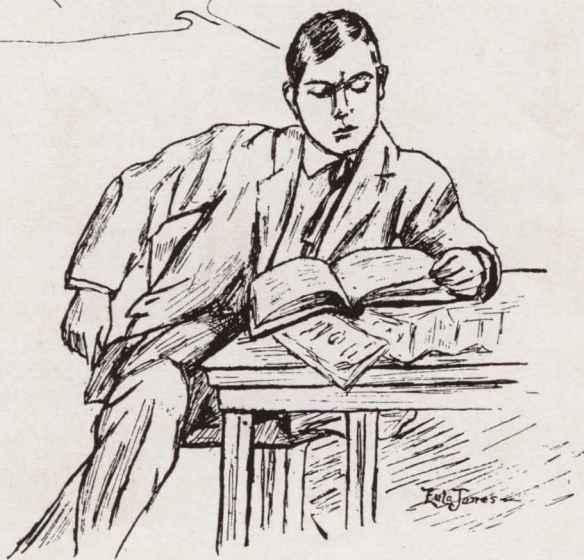
The dream we have cherished these three years—of one day being a Senior—is near and we are carrying on our motto, "Sine aequa," as loyal followers of the Garnet and Gold.

We hope as Freshmen we have done ourselves honor and that we can say proudly we were once a Freshman.

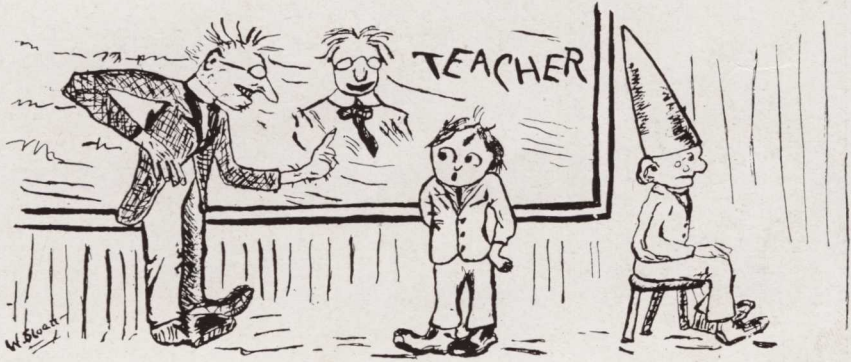

## Young Harris Debating Society

Although Young Harris College is isolated by mountain barriers from the busy world of affairs, it has ever been a hot-bed of debaters of public questions. The first debating society in Brasstown Valley was organized here in 1886, by Mr. J. H. Stephens of Young Harris. It was reorganized October 1, 1887, and named in honor of Judge Young L. G. Harris, who made liberal donations to the college.

In January, 1891, a division occurred, and the Phi Chi Society was organized. The two societies have since served to provoke each other to greater endeavors.

The champion debates have long been the most attractive feature of the commencements at Young Harris. In point of decisions the Young Harris Debating Society has been in the lead ever since 1907. These successes are ascribable to fair dealing and hard work on the part of our men. Surely no one ever worked harder than a Young Harris Debating Society Champion Debater.

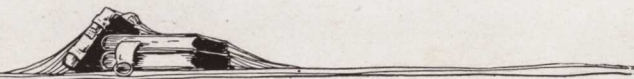
Our motto, "Virtute non viris," adopted in 1911 and liberally translated, "character before numbers," is but a belated expression of a long honored working principle of the society. It is our policy to give every member an opportunity to develop his talent for public speaking, and to reward merit with the highest honor in reach of any Young Harris College student—that of the champion debatership.

Young Harris College has participated in only three intercollegiate debates. These were won over Piedmont College in 1914, '15 and '16. The Phi Chi and the Young Harris Debating Society each furnished a man.

Young Harris Debating Society men learn to reason and to convince. Possessed of these gifts and a passion for truth, enlivened by the wholesome influence of their fellows, scores of these men have found their way across the mountains and into the fields of service. Taking their places with the South's best sons, they have won and are still winning in the battle of life. The world has been blessed by their victories. In the future let the grand old society prove worthy of its history and of its representatives at large.

To the girls of the Susan B. Harris Society we owe much. They have shared our victories and taught us to recognize no defeat but as a stepping-stone to greater victory. Sisters they have been to us—and the end is not yet.

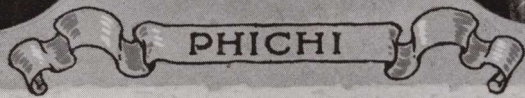
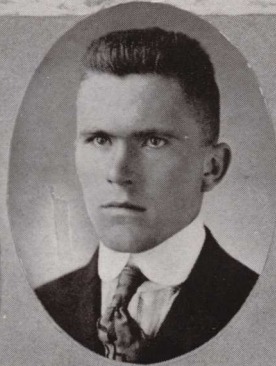

# PHI CHI SIO

## Phi Chi Society

January 24, 1920, the Phi Chi Society commemorates its twenty-ninth anniversary. A complete history of the Phi Chi Society during those twenty-nine years would occupy volumes, hence only a few of the outstanding facts will be mentioned here. It was evident that in the fall of 1890 the group that had composed the Young Harris Society the preceding year were greatly outnumbered by new men, and through their numerical superiority obtained control of the offices and honors of the society. This caused many of the older men to resign and it was in the minds of these men that the Phi Chi Society was first conceived. Some weeks later this group met Saturday night and a mutual agreement was reached: H. J. Fulbright was elected president and a committee was appointed to write the constitution which was submitted by these men and though several times revised is the same in constituency today. January 24, 1891, the Phi Chi Society became an active growing part of Young Harris College.

The society grew very rapidly and the spirit characteristic of all Phi Chis has never waned. Its ex-members have taken leading positions in all the callings of life. It is significant that so many of its ex-members are lawyers. In the ministry and the other professions Phi Chis will be found who "made good". Space does not permit the praising of all the Phi Chis who have brought credit to their society and are carving for themselves a niche in the world of the renowned, but the following stand forth as examples: Prof. J. W. Cantrell of the department of Science, Georgia University; Prof. T. J. Lance of the Waynesboro City Schools and Hon. H. J. Fulbright, State Tax Commissioner.

The part Phi Chi men played in the big war cannot be overestimated. The fall of 1918 saw but five Juniors and no Seniors in the Phi Chi Society. It was noted, especially by all Phi Chis, that it was a former Phi Chi Champion Debater who was company commander of the famous Alvin C. York, Captain William Swanson.

In the fall of 1919 the old society came back strong with a large enrollment. A banquet and reunion was held in Atlanta at the Ansley Hotel to discuss old happenings and the part the sons of the Phi Chi acted in Europe. Some one hundred were present and it was agreed to be a permanent annual affair. Hence the Phi Chi Society is not only a mere debating society but it has grown rather into a great fraternity of men who believe in the perpetuation of college friendships and memories. Surely the founders of the Phi Chi Society implanted the true spirit when they gave it the motto, *Esto perpetua*, "Let it endure forever".

To this end we devote ourselves and bend our every effort to pass on to those who come after a better brand of sport than we found when we came.

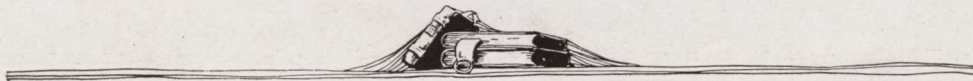
