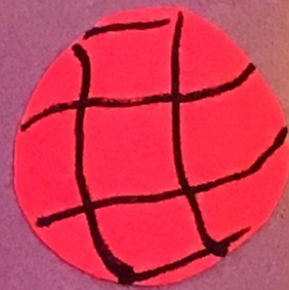

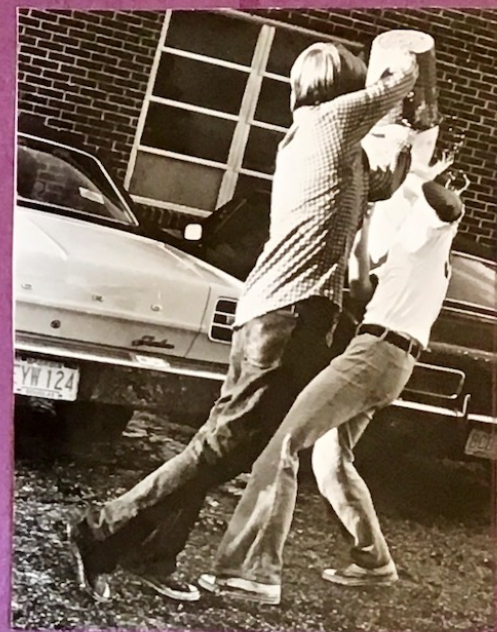
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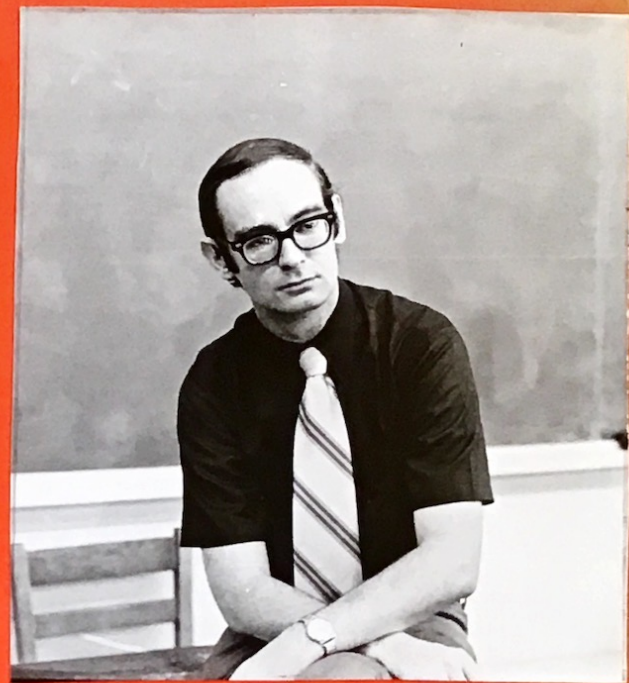

It is not so much as what Dr. Farley has to say to what we can and cannot do. The Board of Trustees has set up certain standards that even Dr. Farley and Dean Wright have to abide by. We have the choice of what school we want to attend. If we don't like the rules and policies of one, then you should not attend that school. For example, Young Harris does not have open dorms. It is useless to try to obtain them because the rules set up by the Board of Trustees says no. And if the students don't like this policy they are free to go elsewhere.

Over the years Young Harris has built a name for itself. It is a church affiliated college with high moral standards. The Trustees are trying to keep these standards.

Another problem we run into changing policies is the older Alumni contribute their funds to the school because they believe in what Young Harris College stands for. If the standards fall, they can no longer provide support for an institution which has changed policy in this direction.
