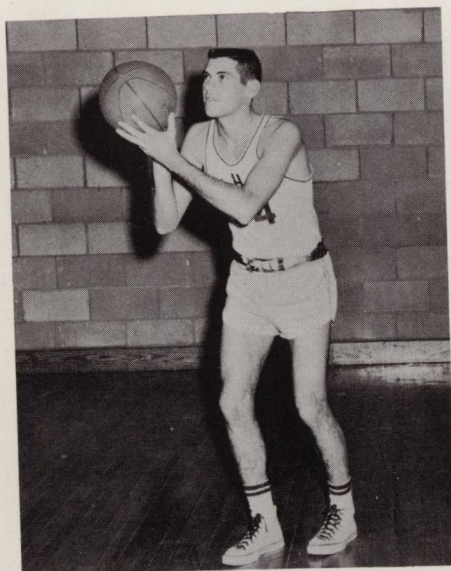

In rebounding, a very important function to any basketball team, Sonny Williams, Virgil Huggins, and

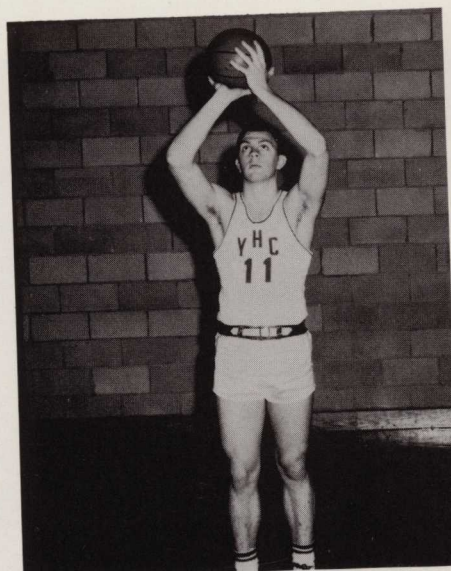
Henry Barnes led the Lions during the season.

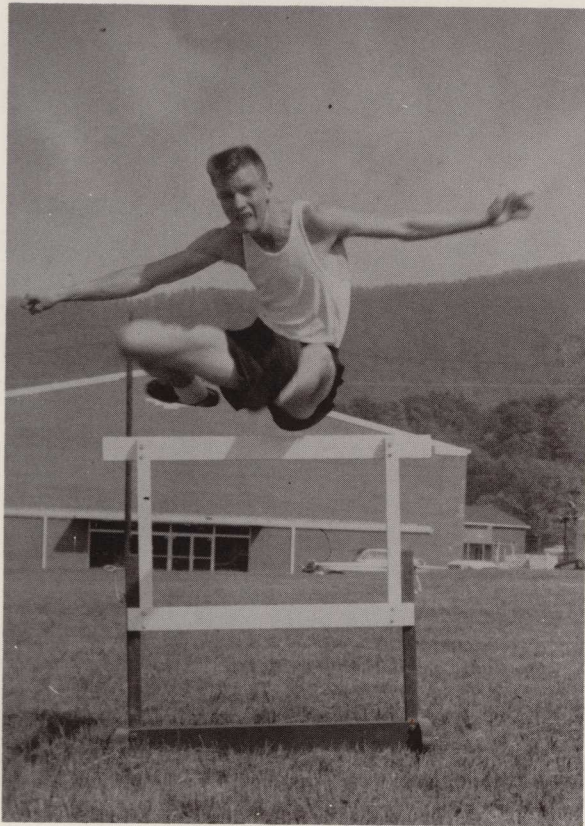

It seems that never a year goes by but that some new building appears on the campus to add to that new, modern, and efficient Young Harris scene.

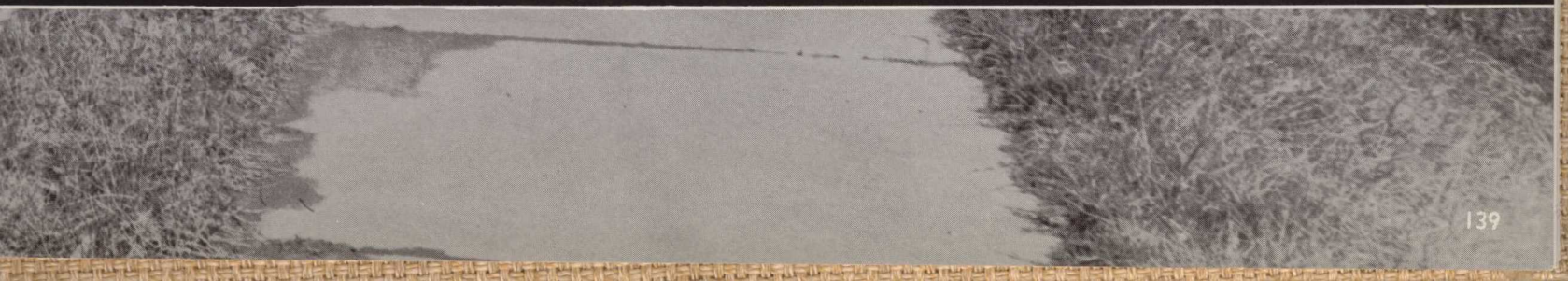
