Pam Worsham of Phi Delta also pointed out that organizations with pledge periods such as the ones being discussed help to keep people on campus and so help them to adjust to college life.


The following statement was then drafted and approved by the Council with only one abstention:



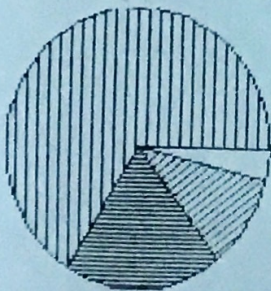

1985 YHC Senate Visitation Policy

This policy will allow students of the opposite sex to visit each other in residence hall rooms under certain specified conditions. The following are the guidelines to be operation of this policy:

1. During all times during visitation the resident is responsible for the actions of the visitor.

2. The resident being visited will be required to have the door of the room open throughout the visitation period.

3. No resident may have more than two (2) visitors at any one time. Small groups may gather in a room provided the door is properly open.

4. Visitors must check-out by the time they leave on the clipboard by their name.

5. The policy will be held on Sunday nights, and on

Thursday nights. All six of the Residence Halls will have the policy operative on these nights. The times for policy will be from 7:00 to 10:00 p.m.

6. At least one Student Senator will be present in each Residence Hall to make sure that the policy is properly run.

The residence directors are to maintain normal control of the residence halls. The Student Senator will report all violations of this policy to the Dean of Students. Visitors are subject to actions taken by the Dean of Students, and the Judicial Board.

Who's Knocking On My Door?

From the founding of our country, people have been much concerned with their rights. One concern each student should have at Young Harris is their rights in privacy in their own room. As spelled out in the "Guide to Student Life" on 18 - The College

February of 1981. As of yet no official changes have been made in this policy.

The policy states clearly that "the exercise of these rights (room searches) will be used with restraint." The policy states that "the staff member making the check should knock before entering the room. Upon entering the room, the staff member is to inform the resident of the purpose of his room being checked. If the resident is not present, the staff member should leave a note for the student to see him/her at a later time concerning the reason for the check. A major part of this policy that students may not

be aware of is the distinction between a room check and a room search. When a staff member makes a room check, he/she may look at anything that is exposed in view. A staff member is able to do so on his/her own initiative and judgement.

A room search on the other hand, must be authorized by either the President or the Dean of Students. It also must be explained by one of these officials or by someone authorized by them to perform a search on their behalf. In a room search, the official may search drawers, chests, trunks, refrigerators, and vehicles that the student has on campus. The "Guide to Student Life" makes the additional point that "an attempt

will be made to have the student present.

There have been very few room searches this year. Donald Benders, Dean of Students, reports that he has been present at all authorized room searches by College at Young Harris. He also added that the students involved in the searches were also present.

The Student Senate has addressed their concerns over this policy. As a result they have found with the help of Parker, President of the College, that the College really has their legal rights with the present policy. It is their feeling and request that the minimum search of a room is to be made in a room search and a room check.

1985 YOUNG HARRIS COLLEGE STUDENT SENATE VISITATION POLICY

This policy will allow students of the opposite sex to visit each other in residence hall rooms under certain specified conditions. The following are the guidelines to the operation of this policy.

1. Visitors must register on a clipboard that will be provided by the Senate in each lobby. The visitor must state their name, name of resident they are visiting, the room number which they will be visiting in, and the time that the visitor is checking-in. The visitor must be accompanied by the person that he/she will be visiting.
2. During all times during visitation the resident is responsible for the actions of the visitor.
3. The resident being visited will be required to have the door of the room open throughout the visitation period.
4. No resident may have more than two(2) visitors at any one time. Small groups may gather in a room provided the door is properly open.
5. Visitors must check-out by placing the time they leave on the clipboard by their name.
6. The policy will be held on Sunday nights, and on Thursday nights. All six of the Residents Halls will have the policy operative on these nights. The times for policy will be from 7:00-10:00pm.
7. At least one Student Senator will be present in each Residence Hall to make sure that the policy is properly run. The residence directors are to maintain normal control of the residence halls. The Student Senator will report all violations of this policy to the Dean of Students. Violators are subject to actions taken by the Dean of Students, and the Judicial Board.

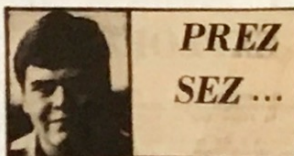

The Results Are In!!

The Feb. 1985 Evaluation Results are in. Nine faculty members, forty three Freshmen and forty eight Sophomores, a total of one-hundred, completed and turned in the forms. The results are as follows: To the question as to

whether or not the Student Senate is meeting its purpose, 96% answered yes, 3% answered no. "Do you feel that the Senate represents the views of the majority of the students at YHC?" 91% yes; 8% no. The 3rd question dealt with the actions of the Senate. "Were there ever times when it acted improperly?" Overall, the response here was good. Some responses indicated that there are areas in which the Senate must work a little harder, such as student-administration relations. "How do you feel about the President of the Student Senate?" A majority felt that he is doing a good job. That he is concerned with the student body as a whole. "What would you give the Senate for this years performance on a scale from 1 to 10.?" The average score was 8.6; Faculty 8.9, Freshman 8.2; Sophomores 8.95. These were the highest evaluations EVER for any Senate. Finally, in the comments section, the students stated that there should be more dances, as well as safe "party places". They were very pleased with the visitation policy and student activities. Senators were told to sign up for Fest committees as they left.

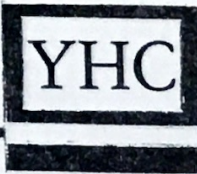

Passing The Torch

We stand today on the edge of a new frontier... a frontier of unknown opportunities and perils... a frontier of unfulfilled hopes and threats.
-John F. Kennedy

When Kennedy stated these words, he was accepting nomination by the Democratic Party for the office of President of the United States. Kennedy realized that the period of the 1960's was going to be a trying time for the citizens of this great land. The 60's were no more trying than the period that we now face. Will the present generation of young people be able to accept the torch and carry it high?

Many times I have looked at my own generation and found a generation which has been titled the "Apathy Generation." Many times I have seen why such a title could be given to our group.
