# Senate Forum Held; Attendance A Problem

The Young Harris Student Senate held its Fall Forum on Wednesday, October 7, in the Susan B. Harris Chapel.

Before opening the forum, Senate President Wesley Weaver reminded the audience that the forum was not to be used as a debating session, but rather as a time for students to share concerns, problems, and ideas with the student body. "The Senate may not have the solutions, but we will assist you in finding appropriate solutions," added Weaver.

The first issue discussed during the forum was the lack of inner door locks in Winship Residence Hall. "Some of us have things that we do not want others to take," explained Tommy Jourdan, "and people simply go into our rooms when we are not there." Others in the audience agreed that the idea of building community trust is fine, but not at the risk of losing personal property.

After several others voiced their opinions on the lock situations, Weaver

then asked Dean Sonnen for his comments concerning the issue. "I have heard many good reasons why locks should be installed, however, we can not add locks overnight. I would suggest, though, that each one of you do your part in helping to keep the suite doors locked," responded Sonnen.

The Willis-Dobbs Dining Hall was the center of focus as the next issue entered the floor. However, before opinions were expressed concerning ARA's food service, Weaver first explained the purpose of the Food Committee. Chaired by ARA Director Chris Railton and Sophomore Carleen Spaulding, the Food Committee's sole purpose is to improve the quality of service provided by Willis-Dobbs. Railton then told students that a suggestion box will be placed in the Dining Hall. "A suggestion box when used properly can be an important tool," Railton said. However, he pointed out that the box should not be used for gripes (constructive criticism), but only for

positive comments. The possibility of a Deli Bar was then discussed, followed by complaints on the student identification card policy and the Dining Hall's cup policy. It seems that many students are still concerned because human error can no longer be an excuse for not having an ID. In short, students without an identification card can not eat. Several students then commented on the Dining Hall's 'no cup' policy im-

plemented by Railton, who described the new policy as a 'cost control method'. In response, students then reminded the audience that cups were allowed in the Dining Hall last year and apparently no money was lost. "What is the difference between drinking three cups inside and taking out one cup," added a member of the audience.

Student Ellie Broom then introduced visitation policy improvements to

forum members, followed by Dean Sonnen as he told students that cable T.V. is on the way. "However," he added, "we need student responses as to why we should or should not install cable."

The Student Senate usually sponsors one forum each month. Because these forums give students the opportunity to express their views on various issues, the Senate encourages everyone to attend.
